HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 42

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION URGING STATE ACTION TO ATTEND THE 2 NEEDS OF CHILDREN AFFECTED BY NATURAL DISASTERS BY IMPLEMENTING A 3 SYSTEM OF PLANNING, RESPONSE AND RECOVERY.

WHEREAS, major disasters resulting in Presidential disaster declarations have increased from an average of 38 per year in the 1980s, to 45 per year in the 1990s, to 52 per year during the first half of this decade; and

8 WHEREAS, the occurrences of major disasters are expected to 9 continue to increase in the foreseeable future, thus making the 10 number of children affected by disasters such as Katrina to grow 11 exponentially; and

12 WHEREAS, schools were closed immediately after Hurricane 13 Katrina, with seven percent of Mississippi elementary and 14 secondary schools remaining closed six months after Katrina, 15 accounting for more than 400,000 children under the age of five, 16 who lived in counties or parishes declared disaster areas by the 17 Federal Emergency Management Agency; and

18 WHEREAS, the number of licensed child care facilities in 19 areas affected by Hurricane Katrina declined by four percent, 20 accounting for 54 facilities in Mississippi closing as a direct 21 result of Hurricane Katrina; and

22 WHEREAS, children are known to benefit from immediate mental 23 health programs following disasters to mitigate long-term impacts; 24 and

25 WHEREAS, the existing system of disaster management in the 26 United States is the purview of federal, state and local 27 government emergency management organizations, and such

28 organizations are not mandated, nor are they able to fully respond 29 to the unique needs of children; and

30 WHEREAS, federal, state and local government emergency 31 professionals lack the technical knowledge, support and contacts 32 to address the unique needs of children that must be incorporated 33 into such professionals' disaster management programs; and

WHEREAS, existing legislative constraints on federal disaster response and recovery aid programs restrict disaster officials from responding to the needs of children in a disaster, and there is no government liaison or programs concerning children's issues in disaster:

39 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF 40 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING 41 THEREIN, That the needs of children affected by major disasters 42 are unique and should be given special consideration in planning, 43 responding to and recovering from major disasters.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Federal Emergency Management Agency and other governmental emergency management professionals should consult with appropriate child-focused nongovernmental organizations and public universities with experience in addressing the needs of children in major disaster preparedness, response, recovery and mitigation, including:

50 (a) Incorporating suggestions from such organizations
51 on children's issues into the national, state and local response
52 plan;

(b) Seeking the recommendations of such organizations
on how to address the needs of children in emergency shelters,
trailer parks and transitional housing sites;

56 (c) Jointly developing child, family and school-focused 57 disaster preparedness materials to support understanding of the 58 impact of disasters on children and strategies to mitigate the 59 impact; and

communities to use in determining children's specific disaster
risks.
