6	School Tigers Football Team has continued its quest to produce the
7	best high school football team and players in Mississippi through
8	its tradition of hard work and hard hitting; and
9	WHEREAS, the Tigers defeated Columbus 42-0 on Friday, October
10	6, 2006, before an estimated crowd of 4,000 in Batesville's Tiger
11	Stadium, for a Mississippi record of 52 consecutive victories; and
12	WHEREAS, South Panola's dynamic feat surpasses the record set
13	by Hamilton in the years 1979-1983; and
14	WHEREAS, what this represents for Coach Ricky Woods is the
15	success associated with hard work contributed by the team; and
16	WHEREAS, classed in the 5A division, the state's largest high
17	school classification, the Tigers have not lost a game since
18	December 4, 2002, when Wayne County beat them 21-14 for the State
19	Championship, having won 14 straight games before that upset; and

- 38 WHEREAS, this team's state-record winning streak has now
- 39 reached 60 games with its fourth consecutive 15-0 season

- 41 Championship game in Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium before
- 42 a crowd of 14,000 on Friday, December 1, 2006; and
- WHEREAS, this latest chapter in the Tiger dynasty is probably
- 44 the most satisfying of all for the incredibly successful coach and
- 45 team which is a credit to the community itself, and which has
- 46 produced young men who have brought honor to their school, their
- 47 community and to the State of Mississippi; and
