(UPS), the world's largest package delivery company that stands 7 8 today as a critical pipeline for global economic activity; and 9 WHEREAS, UPS was founded in 1907 in the City of Seattle by a 19-year-old teenager named Jim Casey, who borrowed \$100.00 to 10 11 start his own messenger service and over the past 100 years, the world has witnessed the transformation of this company from a 12 13 \$100.00 single-city bicycle messenger company into a \$47 billion 14 company; and

15 WHEREAS, throughout the past 100 years, Mr. Casey has guided 16 the transformation of this company from one primarily focused on 17 package delivery in the United States to a broader provider of 18 transportation-based supply chain services; and

WHEREAS, its transformation from a department-store type delivery service into a common carrier offering package delivery service throughout the United States, an international package delivery service with its own airline, and now, a trusted business partner that enables commerce for its customers by synchronizing the flow of goods, information and money has made it the global corporate icon it is today; and

26 WHEREAS, UPS employs more than 427,000 people, operates the 27 world's largest package delivery network, operates the planet's

35 WHEREAS, in addition to its business contributions, UPS 36 incorporates an emphasis on community service and citizenship that 37 is evidenced by its donation of thousands of dollars annually to 38 many charitable organizations, including the Mississippi Food 39 Network and the United Way; and

40 WHEREAS, UPS came to the rescue of Mississippians during the 41 Hurricane Katrina crisis by donating a whopping \$1.25 million to 42 assist Hurricane Katrina relief efforts for Mississippi and Gulf 43 Coast residents; and

44 WHEREAS, UPS strives to continue to provide both a 45 substantial economic impact to the people of Mississippi and focus 46 on cultivating deep partnerships with the communities it serves; 47 and

48 WHEREAS, the services that UPS provides connect the people of 49 Mississippi to more than 200 countries through an expansive 50 transportation network that truly synchronizes global commerce; 51 and

52 WHEREAS, UPS quickly restored service after Hurricane Katrina 53 in spite of the 20 package hubs and centers throughout the region 54 that suffered damage during Katrina and had to be repaired at a 55 total cost of \$8.3 million; and

56 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to recognize 57 and honor companies that not only create economic development 58 opportunities within the state, but give back to our communities 59 in times of crisis:
