HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 108

1 2 3 4	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING PONTOTOC, UNION AND LEE COUNTIES FOR HAVING THE VISION TO FORM THE PUL ALLIANCE AND RECOGNIZING ITS CONTRIBUTIONS IN FACILITATING THE WELLSPRING SITE FOR THE TOYOTA PLANT.
5	WHEREAS, in 2000, visionaries from the Northeast Mississippi
6	Counties of Pontotoc, Union and Lee formed the PUL Alliance in
7	response to the Advantage Mississippi legislation that was passed
8	by the Legislature in August 2000; and
9	WHEREAS, the coalition of these counties that began seven
10	years ago, helped to facilitate the 2007 deal with Toyota that
11	will result in a \$1.5 Billion investment and the creation of over
12	2,000 jobs by Toyota in Blue Springs; and
13	WHEREAS, the coalition worked together to have the
14	Legislature enhance the original Advantage Mississippi legislation
15	by revising it to allow neighboring counties to create
16	partnerships that share expenses and revenues related to an
17	economic development project, instead of limiting those expenses
18	to the city or county in which the project was located; and
19	WHEREAS, these counties again worked with the Legislature to
20	improve the Advantage Mississippi legislation to allow these new
21	partnerships to exist over multiple projects and not be limited to
22	a one time short term deal, and this change was critical to the
23	formation of the PUL Alliance which allowed them to plan as a
24	region and lay the foundation for the current Toyota project; and
25	WHEREAS, the PUL Alliance suffered a setback in 2003 when it
26	lost a Toyota Tundra plant to San Antonio, Texas, but used this
27	experience as a catalyst to improve the Wellspring site to better

fit Toyota's needs; and

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         WHEREAS, Toyota explained that two things were necessary to
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    improve the site: engineering information on the site and land
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    ownership control; and
         WHEREAS, in 2003, important legislation known as the Rural
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    Impact Act was signed into law and helped the PUL Alliance to
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    obtain the engineering information needed by Toyota; and
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          WHEREAS, because of this legislation, in October of 2003,
    Bill Renick, then Chief of Staff to former Governor Ronnie
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    Musgrove, awarded a $250,000 grant to the PUL Alliance for a
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    preliminary site development engineering plan that enabled the PUL
    Alliance to leverage the services of Tennessee Valley Authority
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    (TVA), and after consideration and review in January 2005, TVA
    named the Wellspring site as the 3rd largest certified mega site
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    in the seven state TVA region; and
         WHEREAS, with site certification, the PUL Alliance took the
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    Wellspring project to the Automotive World Congress in
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    Barcelona, Spain, and introduced the project to the automotive
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    industry; and
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         WHEREAS, because land ownership control was still needed, in
    2006, the PUL Alliance sought legislation to create an
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    unprecedented partnership between local and state governments to
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    secure ownership of the Wellspring Project site; and
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         WHEREAS, in spite of the Mississippi House of
    Representatives' foresight to pass legislation to create this
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    unprecedented new partnership, the legislation ultimately failed;
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    and
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         WHEREAS, despite the failed legislation, the tenacity and
    vision of the boards of supervisors of these counties motivated
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    them to pass three resolutions allowing Three Rivers Planning and
    Development District to begin purchasing over $10 Million to gain
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    control of the land; and
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WHEREAS, over the past seven years, many unprecedented

partnerships and collaborations were created as a result of the

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- 63 Counties, and the economic development and business leaders in
- 64 these counties for the citizens of Northeast Mississippi; and
- 65 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to recognize
- 66 the contributions of Mississippi counties which work together for
