## HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 6

1 2	A RESOLUTION TO CREATE A HOUSE STUDY COMMITTEE TO STUDY THE SAFETY AND HEALTHFULNESS OF WORKING CONDITIONS IN MISSISSIPPI.
3	WHEREAS, it is the policy of this state to assure so far as
4	possible safe and healthful working conditions for every working
5	person in the state; and
6	WHEREAS, the Legislature seeks to further the advances
7	already made through employer and employee initiatives providing
8	safe and healthful working conditions; and
9	WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes the separate but
10	dependent responsibilities and rights that employers and employees
11	have with respect to achieving safe and healthful working
12	conditions; and
13	WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes the state's interest and
14	responsibility to promote and preserve Mississippi's human
15	resources by instituting new programs and perfecting existing
16	programs for providing safe and healthful working conditions:
17	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
18	REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That a House study
19	committee is created to study the need and feasibility of
20	establishing within the State Department of Health an office to
21	set mandatory occupational safety and health standards applicable
22	to businesses.
23	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Speaker of the House shall
24	appoint members of the committee. After the members are
25	appointed, the membership shall meet on a date mutually agreed
26	upon by a majority of the members for the purposes of organizing

the committee and establishing rules for transacting its business

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- 28 and keeping records. A majority of members of the committee shall
- 29 constitute a quorum at all committee meetings. An affirmative
- 30 vote of a majority of the members present and voting shall be
- 31 required in the adoption of rules, resolutions, reports and in any
- 32 other actions taken by the committee. All members of the
- 33 committee shall be notified in writing of all regular and special
- 34 meetings of the committee, which notices shall be mailed at least
- 35 five days before the date of the meetings. The committee shall
- 36 hold a minimum of four regular meetings.
- The committee is directed to receive expert testimony,
- 38 information and recommendations related to:
- 39 (a) The field of occupational safety and health, including
- 40 psychological factors, and currently accepted methods, techniques
- 41 and approaches for dealing with occupational safety and health
- 42 problems;
- 43 (b) Current practices for the identification of casual
- 44 connections between diseases and work in environmental conditions,
- 45 as distinguished from occupational safety;
- 46 (c) The adoption of medical criteria which can assure,
- 47 insofar as practicable, that no employee will suffer diminished
- 48 health, functional capacity or life expectancy as a result of work
- 49 experience;
- 50 (d) The establishment of training programs to increase the
- 51 number and competence of Department of Health personnel engaged in
- 52 the field of occupational safety and health; and
- (e) The administration and enforcement of the Federal
- 54 Occupational Safety and Health Act, known as OSHA, by the State
- 55 Department of Health.
- The committee shall make a written report, with findings and
- 57 recommendations including, but not limited to, its discovery of
- 58 appropriate procedures with respect to current and accepted
- 59 occupational safety and health practices, an accurate description
- 60 of the nature of current occupational safety and health programs

61	in Mississippi, an accurate description of the nature of existing
62	occupational safety and health programs in Mississippi, an
63	accurate description of the nature of existing occupational safety
64	and health problems in Mississippi, and a detailed analysis of
65	testimony, statements and opinions of the advantages and
66	disadvantages of implementing, administering and enforcing the
67	Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 to the Mississippi
68	House of Representatives by January 1 of each year. The report
69	shall include an estimate of the projected cost of implementing,
70	administering and enforcing its recommendations as well as the
71	projected cost of implementing, administering and enforcing the
72	"Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970."
73	For attending the meetings of the committee, each member
74	shall be paid, from the Contingent Expense Fund, per diem
75	compensation in the amount authorized by Section 25-3-69,
76	Mississippi Code of 1972, and a mileage allowance and an expense
77	allowance in the amount authorized by Section 51-1-47, Mississippi
78	Code of 1972. However, no per diem compensation, mileage
79	allowance or expense allowance shall be paid for attending
80	meetings of the committee while the Legislature is in session, and
81	no per diem compensation, mileage allowance or expense allowance
82	shall be paid without prior approval of the proper committee.
83	All expenses incurred by or on behalf of the committee shall
84	be paid from funds made available by the House Management
85	Committee from the Contingent Expense Fund, from any funds
86	appropriated for the purpose of this resolution and from any
87	grants or contributions made to the committee for its purpose.
88	In carrying out the provisions of this resolution, the
89	committee may utilize the services, facilities and personnel of
90	all departments, agencies, offices and institutions of the state.
