1 2 3 4 5	A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE LIFE, LEGACY AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF THE HONORABLE LEONARD MORRIS, REPRESENTATIVE FROM HOUSE DISTRICT 11, FOR HIS MANY YEARS OF OUTSTANDING AND DEDICATED SERVICE TO THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI AND EXPRESSING DEEPEST SYMPATHY TO HIS FAMILY UPON HIS PASSING.

11	WHEREAS, Representative Morris was born on September 15,
12	1947, the youngest child of William M. and Azalee Houston Morris
13	and grew up in Batesville, Mississippi, later earning degrees from
14	Northwest Mississippi Community College and the University of
15	Mississippi and attending the University of Oklahoma Economic
16	Development Institute, before beginning his career as a public
17	servant by becoming Executive Director of the North Delta Planning
18	and Development District and serving on the Panola County School
19	Board; and
20	WHEREAS, he began his service as a legislator when he became
21	a member of the Mississippi House of Representatives in 1993,
22	gaining his stature as a statesman by rising from freshman
23	lawmaker to Vice Chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee,
24	where his experience in economic development proved an invaluable
25	asset to the committee, and culminating in his 2004 appointment to
26	serve as Chairman of the House Medicaid Committee, in addition to
27	serving as a member of the House Constitution, Education, Fees and
28	Salaries of Public Officers and Municipalities Committees; and
