| 5 | WHEREAS, on October 16, 2006, the Sullivan-Schein Corporation |

| 9 | WHEREAS, Sullivan-Schein developed TDOT in collaboration with |
| LO | the American Dental Association to exhibit cutting-edge dental |

| L3 | WHEREAS, for the past three years, TDOT has been out of the |

| L5 | outreach in 24 communities, including the Mississippi Gulf Coast |
| L6 | and the City of New Orleans in the wake of Hurricane Katrina; and |
| L7 | WHEREAS, the Mississippi Department of Health is the |
