## HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 76

A RESOLUTION TO CREATE THE HOUSE ASTHMA STRATEGIC PLANNING 1 2 STUDY COMMITTEE TO STUDY THE BURDEN OF ASTHMA IN CHILDREN AND 3 ADULTS IN MISSISSIPPI AND PRIORITIZE THE STRATEGIES TO REDUCE THE 4 BURDEN OF THE DISEASE. 5 WHEREAS, asthma is one of the most chronic health conditions 6 in the world, affecting over 20 million people in the United States and 325,687 in Mississippi in 2003; and 7 8 WHEREAS, asthma is the Number One reason for school 9 absenteeism in Mississippi and nationwide; and WHEREAS, asthma is responsible for more than 500,000 10 11 hospitalizations and 5,000 deaths nationwide; and WHEREAS, asthma costs our nation approximately \$11 billion 12 13 per year in health care costs; and WHEREAS, asthma results in almost \$5 billion in additional 14 costs due to worker absenteeism and lost productivity nationwide; 15 16 and 17 WHEREAS, asthma is the most common childhood disorder, affecting approximately 12.8% (96,835) of children under 18 years 18 of age in Mississippi in 2003; and 19 WHEREAS, asthma accounted for 3,585 emergency room visits in 20 21 children under 15 years old in 2003; and 22 WHEREAS, 237 Mississippians died due to asthma between 1999 and 2003, including 11 children under 15 years old; and 23 24 WHEREAS, asthma prevalence is higher in Mississippians with lower incomes, those with less than high school education, adult 25 26 females and nonwhite adults:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF 27 28 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That there is created 29 the House Asthma Strategic Planning Study Committee, which shall study the burden of asthma in children and adults in Mississippi, 30 31 and priortize the strategies to reduce the burden of the disease 32 as provided in the Mississippi State Asthma Plan 2006-2010, set 33 forth by the statewide Asthma Coalition of Mississippi, to address 34 asthma through a collaborative public health approach thereby improving the health status of Mississippians with asthma. 35

36 The study committee shall consist of four members of the 37 House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker, and one member 38 or representative of each of the following agencies and organizations: State Department of Health - Asthma Program, 39 40 Division of Medicaid, Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality, State Department of Education - Superintendent's office, 41 42 Mississippi School Nurse Association, American Lung Association of 43 Mississippi, State and School Employees Life and Health Insurance 44 Plan, Mississippi Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics, 45 and Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Mississippi.

46 Within thirty days after adoption of this resolution, the 47 Speaker shall appoint the House members of the study committee and 48 the agencies and organizations having members or representatives 49 on the committee shall designate their member or representative to 50 the committee. Within fifteen days after the period designated 51 for making appointments, on a day to be designated by the Speaker, 52 the committee shall meet and organize by selecting from its membership a chairman and a vice chairman. The vice chairman will 53 serve as secretary and is responsible for keeping all records of 54 55 the committee. A majority of the members of the committee constitutes a quorum. An affirmative vote of a majority of the 56 57 committee is required in the transaction of all business. All 58 members must be notified in writing of all meetings, and those

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59 notices must be mailed at least five days before the date on which 60 a meeting is to be held.

Members of the study committee who are not legislators, state 61 officials or state employees shall be compensated at the per diem 62 63 rate authorized by Section 25-3-69 and shall be reimbursed in 64 accordance with Section 25-3-41 for mileage and actual expenses 65 incurred in the performance of their duties. Legislative members of the committee shall be paid from the contingent expense funds 66 of their respective houses in the same manner as provided for 67 68 committee meetings when the Legislature is not in session; however, no per diem or expense for attending meetings of the 69 70 committee may be paid while the Legislature is in session. A committee member may not incur per diem, travel or other expenses 71 72 unless previously authorized by vote, at a meeting of the committee, which action must be recorded in the official minutes 73 74 of the meeting. Nonlegislative members will be paid from any 75 funds made available to the committee for that purpose. The study committee shall make a report of its findings and 76 77 recommendations, including any recommended legislation, to the

79 presentation of its report to the House, the committee shall be 80 dissolved.
