1 2 3	A RESOLUTION URGING THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI TO RECOGNIZE AUGUST 17 THROUGH AUGUST 29, 2007, AS A TIME OF HURRICANE AWARENESS AND PREPAREDNESS OBSERVATION.
4	WHEREAS, history teaches that a lack of hurricane awareness
5	and preparation are common threads among all major hurricane
6	disasters; and
7	WHEREAS, by simply knowing one's level of vulnerability and
8	what appropriate actions should be taken, the effects of a
9	hurricane disaster can be greatly reduced; and
10	WHEREAS, both public and private entities should develop
11	emergency response and recovery plans in accordance with local
12	jurisdictions and local emergency management offices; and
13	WHEREAS, the best defense is preparedness and public
14	education about the dangers of high winds, storm surge, flooding
15	and tornadoes that may occur for hundreds of miles in conjunction
16	with a hurricane or tropical storm; and
17	WHEREAS, hurricanes devastate our communities, endangering
18	thousands of human lives and causing billions of dollars in
19	property damage, and their fierce and destructive power alone
20	requires that we all take steps to reduce our vulnerability to
21	this natural hazard; and
22	WHEREAS, according to the Federal Emergency Management Agency
23	(FEMA) and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, an
24	average of 10 tropical storms develop annually over the Atlantic
25	Ocean, Caribbean Sea and Gulf of Mexico; and

WHEREAS, every year, an average of six of these storms grow

- 28 five hurricanes which strike the United States coastline every
- 29 three years, two of which will have winds exceeding 111 miles per
- 30 hour, qualifying them as major hurricanes; and
- 31 WHEREAS, more than 50 million people live along
- 32 hurricane-prone coastlines in the United States, with millions of
- 33 tourists visiting these areas annually; and
- 34 WHEREAS, during this time of Mississippi Hurricane Awareness
- 35 and Preparedness Observation, we encourage those who live in
- 36 coastal areas, as well as all concerned Mississippians, to be more
- 37 vigilant in preparing for hurricanes and other natural disasters
- 38 before they occur; and
- 39 WHEREAS, by promoting awareness of hurricane hazards and
- 40 helping with relief efforts when these powerful storms strike, we
- 41 can reduce the risks of hurricane damage and help our neighbors
- 42 recover more quickly from their devastating effects; and
- WHEREAS, with preparation, forecasting and coordination, we
- 44 can save lives and improve our state's ability to withstand the
- 45 impact of hurricanes:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 47 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby
- 48 recognize August 17 through August 29, 2007, as the time of
- 49 Hurricane Awareness and Preparedness Observation in the State of
- 50 Mississippi, and call on government agencies, private
- 51 organizations, schools, news media, and residents in
- 52 hurricane-prone areas to share information about hurricane
- 53 preparedness and response in order to help prevent storm damage
- 54 and save lives.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be
- 56 furnished to Ms. Dana Nelson and to the members of the Capitol
- 57 Press Corps.
