- QUITMAN, MISSISSIPPI, WHO WAS KILLED IN ACTION IN IRAQ ON WEDNESDAY, MARCH 21, 2007, AND EXPRESSING DEEPEST SYMPATHY TO HIS FAMILY AND FRIENDS UPON HIS PASSING. 4

- 6 WHEREAS, United States Marine Corps Corporal Dustin J. Lee,
- 7 20, of Quitman, Mississippi, the son of Mississippi Highway Patrol
- Trooper Jerome Lee and Quitman schoolteacher Rachel Lee, was 8
- killed in action on Wednesday, March 21, 2007, from a mortar 9
- attack while conducting combat operations against anti-Iraqi 10
- forces in the Al Anbar Province, in Fallujah, Iraq, joining an 11
- 12 eternal fraternal order of comrades who, like him, gave the
- ultimate sacrifice of life that others may come to know freedom 13
- 14 and democracy as more than a distant dream, but a reality; and
- WHEREAS, assigned to the Third Recon Battalion, Battery 3rd 15
- Platoon, II Marine Expeditionary Force, Corporal Lee was borne by 16
- a Marine Honor Guard, upon his final return to his family and to 17
- 18 his community; and
- WHEREAS, an all-American boy who loved life and carried the 19
- respect of all in his community, Corporal Lee, for his courageous 20
- 21 service and supreme sacrifice, was buried with full military
- 22 honors, during which time he was posthumously awarded the Navy
- 23 Cross; and
- WHEREAS, a Christian who was always fair and looked for the 24
- good in people, Dustin joined the Marines after graduating from 25
- Quitman High School in 2004; and 26
- 27 WHEREAS, since operations began in Iraq and Afghanistan, at
- 28 least 49 soldiers or sailors with Mississippi ties have paid the

- 29 most honorable toll of military service with the ultimate
- 30 sacrifice of life in order that others may have the opportunity to
- 31 experience a life of freedom; and
- 32 WHEREAS, sorely missed by those who experienced the depth of
- 33 his love, commitment and compassion for life and pursuit of
- 34 freedom for all, the legacy of his memory will forever be etched
- 35 in the hearts and lives of his survivors, including: father,
- 36 State Trooper Jerome Lee; mother, Rachel; sister, Madyson;
- 37 brother, Camryn; aunts; uncles; and many close friends; and
- 38 WHEREAS, Corporal Lee was a dutiful son who is counted among
- 39 America's heroes, committed to our nation's safety and security;

- 41 WHEREAS, to a country, a fallen soldier means a national
- 42 loss; to a community, a fallen soldier means a true hero; to a
- 43 parent, a fallen soldier means a son who won't be coming home; and
- WHEREAS, Mississippians understand the costs of conflict,
- 45 because we have paid them in the past, and it is with great pride
- 46 and humility that we recognize the heroic action of this great
- 47 American and Mississippian, who was the guardian of civilization
- 48 as we know it today:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF

- 51 remember the gallant service and commend the life of United States
- 52 Marine Corporal Dustin J. Lee of Quitman, Mississippi, who was
- 53 killed in action in Iraq on Wednesday, March 21, 2007, and express
- 54 deepest sympathy to his family and friends upon his passing.
