SENATE BILL NO. 2017

1 AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR A TUITION WAIVER FOR SPOUSES OF MEMBERS 2 OF THE MISSISSIPPI NATIONAL GUARD IN ACTIVE DRILLING STATUS; TO 3 PROVIDE FOR TUITION STABILIZATION PAYMENTS FOR MISSISSIPPI 4 NATIONAL GUARD MEMBERS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) Spouses of any member of the Mississippi 7 National Guard in active drilling status shall be entitled to 8 receive a tuition waiver of fifty percent (50%) for a maximum of 9 eight (8) semesters at any state university or community and 10 junior college.

11 (2) For the purposes of this section, the term "spouse" 12 means a person who has entered into a marital contract, as 13 recognized by the State of Mississippi, with a Mississippi 14 National Guardsman and is further defined as a "dependant" by the 15 Mississippi Adjutant General. In order to qualify for the tuition 16 waiver, the spouse shall be a resident of Mississippi during the 17 semester the waiver was received.

(3) The tuition waiver may only be used for undergraduate 18 studies or vocational education courses, whether such coursework 19 is taken on a semester or clock-hour basis. In no event shall a 20 21 spouse be eligible for the tuition waiver after receipt of an 22 undergraduate degree, whether received through this section or not. No spouse shall be eligible for a tuition waiver after ten 23 24 (10) years from the date of the first semester waiver under this 25 section.

26 (4) The Adjutant General shall set up minimum academic
27 standards for performance that must be met in order to maintain
28 eligibility for continuing in the program.

No. 2017 * SS01/R321* 07/SS01/R321 PAGE 1 29 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) Mississippi National Guard members in an 30 active drilling status, including SMP cadets, shall receive a 31 tuition stabilization payment of Four Thousand Five Hundred 32 Dollars (\$4,500.00) per year or the amount authorized by the 33 Federal Tuition Assistance Program, whichever is greater, for 34 undergraduate studies at any state four-year university.

35 (2) For the purposes of this section, a year is defined as a
36 Spring semester of eighteen (18) hours, a Summer semester of six
37 (6) hours and a Fall semester of eighteen (18) hours.

38 (3) The Adjutant General shall set up minimum academic
39 standards for performance that must be met in order to maintain
40 eligibility for continuing in the program.

41 (4) An individual must be a member of the Mississippi
42 National Guard for the entire semester that he receives the
43 tuition stabilization award.

44 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 45 and after July 1, 2007.
