1	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 9-7-81 AND 9-11-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE
2	OF 1972, TO REVISE THE JURISDICTIONAL AMOUNT OF JUSTICE COURT AND
3	TO CLARIFY THE EXCLUSIVENESS OF THAT JURISDICTION; AND FOR RELATED
4	PURPOSES.

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** Section 9-7-81, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 9-7-81. The circuit court shall have original jurisdiction
- 9 in all actions when the principal of the amount in controversy
- 10 exceeds Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), and of all other
- 11 actions and causes, matters and things arising under the
- 12 Constitution and laws of this state which are not exclusively
- 13 cognizable in some other court, and such appellate jurisdiction as
- 14 prescribed by law. Such court shall have power to hear and
- 15 determine all prosecutions in the name of the state for treason,
- 16 felonies, crimes and misdemeanors, except such as may be
- 17 exclusively cognizable before some other court; and said court
- 18 shall have all the powers belonging to a court of oyer and
- 19 terminer and general jail delivery, and may do and perform all
- 20 other acts properly pertaining to a circuit court of law.
- 21 **SECTION 2.** Section 9-11-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 22 amended as follows:
- 9-11-9. Justice court judges shall have exclusive
- 24 jurisdiction of all actions for the recovery of debts or damages
- 25 or personal property, where the principal of the debt, the amount
- of the demand, or the value of the property sought to be recovered
- 27 shall not exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00).

- The justice court judges shall have no pecuniary interest in
- 29 the outcome of any action once suit has been filed.
- 30 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 31 and after July 1, 2007, and shall apply only to causes of action
- 32 filed after that date.
