SENATE BILL NO. 2343

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 81-1-65, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 PROVIDE THAT THE COMMISSIONER OF BANKING SHALL REQUIRE ALL 3 EMPLOYEES AND APPLICANTS FOR EMPLOYMENT WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF 4 BANKING TO BE FINGERPRINTED TO DETERMINE THEIR SUITABILITY FOR 5 EMPLOYMENT AS EXAMINERS OR ASSISTANTS, AS A CONDITION OF 6 EMPLOYMENT WITH THE DEPARTMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 81-1-65, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

81-1-65. The commissioner shall employ such assistants, to 10 11 be known as state banking examiners, as may be necessary for the 12 efficient operation of the department, to aid him in the discharge of the duties and responsibilities imposed upon him by law. The 13 14 minimum qualifications for such employment shall be possession of 15 a bachelor's degree from a recognized college or university, or 16 three (3) years' experience as a bank examiner, bank officer or 17 employee, small loan company officer or employee, or other 18 consumer finance officer or employee and such other qualifications set out for banking examiners in the plan for the state personnel 19 system. However, notwithstanding any provisions to the contrary, 20 any person who is serving as a state banking examiner in the 21 22 former Department of Bank Supervision on March 21, 1980, shall be 23 qualified to serve as a state banking examiner in the department. The state bank examiners shall not, directly or indirectly, be 24 25 connected with any banking business in Mississippi or elsewhere during their respective terms of office, after four (4) months 26 27 from the time of qualifying as an examiner.

28 The commissioner may employ such additional employees as may 29 be necessary to carry out those duties and responsibilities S. B. No. 2343 *SS01/R782* G1/2 07/SS01/R782 PAGE 1 30 imposed upon him by law, who shall possess such qualifications set 31 out for their particular position in the plan for the state 32 personnel system.

33 No examiner or other employee related by consanguinity or 34 affinity to the commissioner within the third degree computed 35 according to the civil law shall be employed by him.

The examiners and all other persons employed by the commissioner under the provisions of this section shall be compensated as provided in the compensation plan for the state personnel system, unless otherwise provided by law. The compensation for such employees shall be payable monthly out of the funds of the department.

The commissioner shall be responsible for all acts of the examiners and the other employees. Any examiner or other employee may be dismissed only in accordance with the laws, rules and regulations applicable to the state personnel system.

46 As a condition of employment with the department, the 47 commissioner shall require all employees and applicants for employment with the department to be fingerprinted to determine 48 49 their suitability for employment as examiners or assistants as 50 needed. If no disqualifying record is identified at the state 51 level, the Department of Public Safety shall forward the 52 fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) for a national criminal history record check. The Department of Banking 53 54 and Consumer Finance shall pay all of the costs in connection with the criminal history record check procedure. These record checks 55 56 shall not be used by the Department of Banking and Consumer Finance for any purpose other than to determine suitability for 57 58 employment with the department. 59 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
