SENATE BILL NO. 2415

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-1-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 REVISE THE LENGTH OF TIME A PERSON UNDER THE AGE OF 17 MUST 2 3 PRACTICE SUPERVISED DRIVING UNDER A TEMPORARY PERMIT IN ORDER TO 4 BE ELIGIBLE FOR AN INTERMEDIATE LICENSE; TO REVISE THE LENGTH OF TIME AN INTERMEDIATE LICENSE MUST BE HELD; AND FOR RELATED 5 6 PURPOSES. 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 63-1-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 9 amended as follows: 63-1-9. (1) No driver's license, intermediate license or 10 11 temporary learning permit shall be issued pursuant to this 12 article: (a) To any person under the age of eighteen (18) years 13 14 except as provided in this article. 15 (b) To any person whose license to operate a motor vehicle on the highways of Mississippi has been previously revoked 16 17 or suspended by this state or any other state * * * or territory 18 of the United States or the District of Columbia, and such revocation or suspension period has not expired. 19 (c) To any person who is an habitual drunkard or who is 20 addicted to the use of other narcotic drugs. 21 22 (d) To any person who would not be able by reason of 23 physical or mental disability, in the opinion of the commissioner or other person authorized to grant an operator's license, to 24 25 operate a motor vehicle on the highways with safety. However, persons who have one (1) arm or leg, or have arms or legs 26 27 deformed, and have their car provided with mechanical devices whereby they are able to drive in a safe manner over the highways, 28 if otherwise qualified, shall receive an operator's license the 29 * SS02/ R458* S. 30 same as other persons. Moreover, deafness shall not be a bar to 31 obtaining a license.

32 (e) To any person who is under the age of seventeen 33 (17) years to drive any motor vehicle while in use as a school bus 34 for the transportation of pupils to or from school, or to drive 35 any motor vehicle while in use as a public or common carrier of 36 persons or property.

37 (f) To any person as an operator who has previously 38 been adjudged to be afflicted with and suffering from any mental 39 disability and who has not at time of application been restored to 40 mental competency.

(g) To any unmarried person under the age of eighteen (18) years who does not at the time of application present a diploma or other certificate of high school graduation or a general education development certificate issued to the person in this state or any other state, or documentation that the person: (i) Is enrolled and making satisfactory progress

49 (ii) Is enrolled in school in this state or any50 other state;

51 (iii) Is enrolled in a "nonpublic school," as such 52 term is defined in Section 37-13-91(2)(i); or

53 (iv) Is unable to attend any school program due to
54 circumstances deemed acceptable as set out in Section 63-1-10.

55 (h) To any person under the age of eighteen (18) years 56 who has been convicted under Section 63-11-30.

57 (2) All permits and licenses issued on or before <u>September</u>
58 30, <u>2007</u>, shall be valid according to the terms upon which issued.
59 From and after <u>October</u> 1, <u>2007</u>:

60 (a) A temporary driving permit may be issued to any
61 person who is at least fifteen (15) years of age who otherwise
62 meets the requirements of this article.

63 An intermediate license may be issued to any person (b) 64 who is at least fifteen (15) years of age who otherwise meets the 65 requirements of this article and who has held a temporary driving permit for at least one (1) year without any conviction under 66 Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation. 67 Any conviction under Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation shall restart the 68 69 one-year requirement for the holding of a temporary driving permit 70 before an applicant can qualify for an intermediate license.

A driver's license may be issued to any person who 71 (C) 72 is at least sixteen (16) years of age who otherwise meets the 73 requirements of this article and who has held an intermediate license for at least six (6) months without any conviction under 74 75 Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation. Any conviction under Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation shall restart the 76 77 six-month requirement for the holding of an intermediate license 78 before an applicant can qualify for a driver's license. However, 79 a person who is at least seventeen (17) years of age who has been 80 issued a temporary driving permit and who has never been convicted 81 under Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation shall not be 82 required to have held an intermediate license.

83 An applicant for a Mississippi driver's license (d) 84 who, at the time of application, is at least sixteen (16) years of 85 age and who has held a valid motor vehicle driver's license issued by another state for at least six (6) months shall not be required 86 87 to hold a temporary driving permit or an intermediate license before being issued a driver's license. 88

89 (3) The commissioner shall ensure that the temporary driving permit, intermediate license and driver's license issued under 90 this article are clear, distinct and easily distinguishable from 91 92 one another.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 93 94 and after July 1, 2007.
