SENATE BILL NO. 2430

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-15-64.4, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO ALLOW LIVE BAIT DEALERS TO BE LOCATED INLAND WITHIN THE THREE 3 COASTAL COUNTIES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 49-15-64.4, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

7 49-15-64.4. (1) Each live bait catcher boat engaged in
8 taking live bait shrimp shall pay an annual privilege tax of One
9 Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for each boat engaged in those
10 operations. The operations shall not exceed two (2) boats per
11 license.

(2) Each "live bait dealer" engaging in selling or otherwise 12 13 dispensing live bait to sport fishermen shall pay an annual privilege tax of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) and must make written 14 15 application to the commission providing the name of the applicant's "live bait catcher boat," the name of the captain of 16 that "live bait catcher boat," the dealer's Mississippi state 17 sales tax number and a sworn statement that dead shrimp will not 18 be sold in containers having a volume in excess of sixteen (16) 19 ounces. Licensed live bait catcher boats and licensed live bait 20 21 dealers shall not operate as commercial shrimpers or commercial 22 shrimp dealers or otherwise engage in commercial shrimping operations. Live bait dealers shall only sell or otherwise 23 24 dispose of bait shrimp when alive or dead with heads attached solely as bait to recreational fishermen or other licensed live 25 bait dealers as regulated by the commission. Only licensed 26 27 commercial shrimpers may transport shrimp across the state line

for the purpose of selling or delivering live bait to another 28 29 state. Any person, firm or corporation found guilty of purchasing shrimp from a live bait camp or live bait catcher boat, other than 30 for the purpose described in this section, shall be fined Five 31 32 Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for the first offense and shall be 33 fined Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) and forfeit all seafood 34 licenses for a second or subsequent offense. In addition, each application for a "live bait dealer" license shall contain a 35 statement of the operating hours, at least eight (8) per 36 37 twenty-four-hour period, and the location of the camp which must be accessible to the general public by public road or \* \* \* waters 38 39 located within the three (3) coastal counties. Applications for "live bait dealers" license must be completed and submitted to the 40 41 commission between the first day of January and the last day of April of each year. Any "live bait dealer" desiring to engage in 42 43 the catching of live shrimp in one (1) location and then 44 transporting them to the dealer's licensed live bait camp by truck shall first make written application to the commission providing 45 the make and model of the truck, a Mississippi license tag number 46 47 and shall be responsible for its adherence to all regulations duly adopted by the commission for the transportation of live bait 48 49 shrimp. Upon receipt of the application, the commission shall 50 verify that the applicant is in compliance with all applicable laws and regulations and after that verification the commission 51 52 shall issue a permit authorizing the transportation of live shrimp. 53

54 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 55 and after its passage.
