SENATE BILL NO. 2516 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 19-25-13, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 TO AUTHORIZE THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF ANY COUNTY, IN ITS 3 DISCRETION, TO INCLUDE IN ITS ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$1,000.00 FOR EXPENDITURE BY THE SHERIFF TO PROVIDE FOOD, WATER AND BEVERAGES FOR THE SHERIFF, THE 4 5 SHERIFF'S DEPUTIES, STATE, NATIONAL AND LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS, EMERGENCY PERSONNEL, COUNTY EMPLOYEES AND MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL PUBLIC WHO THE SHERIFF REQUESTS TO ASSIST HIM AND HIS 6 7 8 9 OFFICE WHILE IN THE PERFORMANCE OF SEARCH AND RESCUE MISSIONS, DISASTERS OR OTHER EMERGENCY OPERATIONS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 10 11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 12 SECTION 1. Section 19-25-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 13 amended as follows: 14 19-25-13. The sheriff shall, at the July meeting of the board of supervisors, submit a budget of estimated expenses of his 15 16 office for the ensuing fiscal year beginning October 1 in such 17 form as shall be prescribed by the Director of the State Department of Audit. The board shall examine this proposed budget 18 19 and determine the amount to be expended by the sheriff in the 20 performance of his duties for the fiscal year and may increase or 21 reduce said amount as it deems necessary and proper. The budget shall include amounts for compensating the 22 deputies and other employees of the sheriff's office, for 23 24 insurance providing protection for the sheriff and his deputies in

and transportation expenses of the sheriff and deputies, for feeding prisoners and inmates of the county jail, and for such other expenses as may be incurred in the performance of the duties

case of disability, death and other similar coverage, for travel

29 of the office of sheriff. In addition, the budget shall include 30 amounts for the payment of premiums on bonds and insurance for the

31 sheriff and his deputies which, in the opinion of the board of
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32 supervisors, are deemed necessary to protect the interests of the 33 county or the sheriff and his deputies. Such amounts may include 34 official bonds and any bonds required of his deputies by the sheriff; liability insurance; insurance against false arrest 35 36 charges; insurance against false imprisonment charges; theft, fire 37 and other hazards insurance; and hospitalization insurance as provided for in Sections 25-15-101 and 25-15-103. The board may 38 authorize the reimbursement of the sheriff and deputies for the 39 use of privately owned automobiles or other motor vehicles in the 40 41 performance of official duties at the rate provided by law for state officers and employees, or may authorize the purchase by the 42 43 sheriff of such motor vehicles and such equipment as may be needed for operation of the sheriff's office, such vehicles and equipment 44 45 to be owned by the county. In counties which have elected to purchase the motor vehicles and such equipment for the operation 46 47 of the sheriff's office, if a sheriff or deputy shall be required 48 in the performance of his official duties, in the event of an 49 emergency, to use his privately owned automobile or other motor 50 vehicle, the board of supervisors may, in its discretion, 51 authorize the reimbursement for such use at the rate per mile 52 provided by law for state officers and employees. This shall not 53 be construed as giving an officer a choice of whether to use his 54 own or the county's vehicle, but shall be construed so as not to 55 penalize an officer who must use his own vehicle because the 56 county's vehicle was not available.

57 <u>The board of supervisors, in its discretion, may include in</u> 58 its annual budget for the sheriff's office an amount not to exceed 59 <u>One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), which may be expended by the</u> 60 <u>sheriff to provide food, water and beverages for the sheriff, the</u> 61 <u>sheriff's deputies, state, national and local law enforcement</u> 62 <u>officers, emergency personnel, county employees and members of the</u> 63 <u>general public who the sheriff requests to assist him and his</u>

64 office while in the performance of search and rescue missions,

65 disasters or other emergency operations.

66 The board of supervisors may acquire one or more credit cards 67 which may be used by the sheriff and his deputies to pay expenses 68 incurred by them when traveling in or out of state in the 69 performance of their official duties. The chancery clerk or 70 county purchase clerk shall maintain complete records of all credit card numbers and all receipts and other documents relating 71 to the use of such credit cards. The sheriff shall furnish 72 73 receipts for the use of such credit cards each month to the 74 chancery clerk or purchase clerk who shall submit a written report 75 monthly to the board of supervisors, which report shall include an 76 itemized list of all expenditures and use of the credit cards for 77 the month, and such expenditures may be allowed for payment by the county in the same manner as other items on the claims docket. The 78 79 issuance of a credit card to a sheriff or his deputy under the 80 provisions of this section shall not be construed to authorize such sheriff or deputy sheriff to use such credit card to make any 81 82 expenditure which is not otherwise authorized by law.

83 The board of supervisors is hereby authorized and empowered, 84 in its discretion, to appropriate and pay a sum not to exceed Four 85 Hundred Dollars (\$400.00) annually as a clothing allowance to each 86 plainclothes investigator employed by the sheriff's office of such 87 The board of supervisors of any county bordering on the county. 88 Gulf of Mexico and having a population of more than thirty-one thousand seven hundred (31,700) but less than thirty-one thousand 89 90 eight hundred (31,800) according to the 1990 Federal Census may appropriate and pay a sum not to exceed Four Hundred Dollars 91 (\$400.00) annually as a clothing allowance to the administrator of 92 93 the county jail.

94 The board of supervisors shall, at its first meeting of each 95 quarter beginning on October 1, January 1, April 1 and July 1, 96 appropriate a lump sum for the sheriff for the expenses of his S. The quarterly appropriation 98 shall be one-fourth (1/4) of the amount approved in the annual 99 budget unless the sheriff requests a different amount. Except in 100 case of emergency, as provided in the county budget law, the 101 appropriation for the quarter beginning in October of the last 102 year of the sheriff's term shall not exceed one-fourth (1/4) of 103 the annual budget.

104 The sheriff shall file a report of all expenses of his office 105 incurred during the preceding month with the board of supervisors 106 for approval at its regular monthly meeting in a form to be 107 prescribed by the Director of the State Department of Audit, and upon filing thereof, and approval by the board, the clerk of the 108 109 board shall issue warrants in payment thereof but not to exceed the budget appropriation for that quarter. Any appropriated funds 110 which are unexpended at the end of the fiscal year shall remain in 111 112 the county general fund.

113 The budget for the sheriff's office may be revised at any 114 regular meeting by the board of supervisors. Upon recommendation 115 of the sheriff, the board may at any regular meeting make 116 supplemental appropriations to the sheriff's office.

117 Any fees previously required to be paid by a sheriff shall be 118 paid by the board of supervisors by including the estimates 119 therefor in the sheriff's budget. All fees and charges for 120 services heretofore collected by sheriffs shall be collected by 121 said sheriff and paid monthly into the general fund of the 122 concerned county. However, any fees heretofore collected by such 123 sheriffs from the county shall not be paid.

124 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 125 and after July 1, 2007.

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
