(b) Three (3) justice court judges appointed by the 16 Conference of Justice Court Judges. 17 (c) Two (2) circuit court clerks appointed by the 18 Circuit Clerks Association. 19 20 (d) One (1) circuit judge appointed by the Conference 21 of Circuit Judges. (e) One (1) county court judge appointed by the 22 Conference of County Court Judges. 23 24 (f) One (1) supervisor appointed by the Mississippi 25 Association of Supervisors. A Committee, the Chairman of the Senate Elections Committee and the Chairman of the House Apportionment and Elections Committee, or their designees, shall serve as legislative liaisons and nonvoting members.

32 (3) The member of the task force who is appointed by the 33 Chief Justice of the Supreme Court shall serve as chairman of the task force. The task force shall meet at the call of the chairman 34 and at its first meeting shall select a vice chairman from among 35 The vice chairman shall also serve as secretary 36 its membership. 37 of the task force and shall be responsible for keeping all records of the task force. A majority of the members of the task force 38 39 shall constitute a quorum.

40 (4) The task force shall file a report with the Clerk of the
41 House of Representatives and the Secretary of the Senate
42 containing its findings and recommendations regarding the justice
43 court system by not later than December 1, 2007.

44 (5) Legislative members of the committee shall receive per diem, travel or other expenses, if authorized by the Management 45 46 Committees of the House of Representatives and the Senate, from 47 the contingent expense funds of their respective houses in the 48 same amounts as provided for committee meetings when the 49 Legislature is not in session; provided that no per diem or 50 expense for attending meetings of the committee shall be paid while the Legislature is in session. 51

52 (6) Nonlegislative members of the task force shall receive 53 no compensation for their service on the task force but may be 54 reimbursed for expenses related to their service on the task force 55 as authorized by law.

56 (7) The task force shall be dissolved on December 1, 2007.
57 SECTION 2. A constable that serves as a bailiff in justice
58 court for criminal cases may be paid by the county in an amount
59 equal to the allowance paid to riding bailiffs as provided in
