## SENATE BILL NO. 2664

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 29-5-161, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO EXEMPT THE STATE VETERANS HOMES FROM THE PROHIBITION ON SMOKING 3 IN GOVERNMENT AND UNIVERSITY CLASSROOM BUILDINGS; AND FOR RELATED 4 PURPOSES. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 29-5-161, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 7 8 29-5-161. (1) As used in this section: 9 "Smoke" or "smoking" means inhaling, exhaling, (a) 10 burning, carrying or otherwise possessing any lighted cigarette, 11 cigar, pipe or any other object or device of any form that contains lighted tobacco. 12 "Government building" means the New State Capitol 13 (b) Building, the Woolfolk State Office Building, the Carroll Gartin 14 Justice Building, the Walter Sillers Office Building, the Heber 15 16 Ladner Building, the Department of Transportation Building, the Robert E. Lee Office Building, the Robert G. Clark, Jr. Building, 17 the State Board of Health Building, the Public Employees' 18 Retirement System Building, the Central High Building, the Court 19 of Appeals Building, the War Veterans' Memorial Building, the 20 21 State Archives Building, the Ike Sanford Veterans Affairs 22 Building, the Old State Capitol Building, the Burroughs Building, the Mayfair Building, 101 Capitol Centre and any other facility in 23 24 the state that is owned or leased by the State of Mississippi or any agency, department or institution of the state and that is 25 26 used for housing state employees during the time of performance of their regular duties for the state; any building owned, rented, 27 28 leased, occupied or operated by the state, including the \* SS26/ R1052\* S. legislative, executive and judicial branches of state government; 29 30 any county, municipality or any other political subdivision of the state; any public authority, commission, agency or public benefit 31 corporation; or any other separate corporate instrumentality or 32 33 unit of state or local government. If only part of a facility is 34 leased by the state or an agency, department or institution of the 35 state, or any county, municipality or other political subdivision of the state, only the leased part of the facility will be 36 considered to be a government building for the purposes of this 37 38 definition. The term "government building" shall not include the state veterans homes, any building owned or leased by the state 39 institutions of higher learning or the public community and junior 40 colleges, or any space in a government building used by law 41 enforcement officers. 42

43 (c) "University or college classroom building" means 44 any building used by the state institutions of higher learning or 45 the public community and junior colleges exclusively for student 46 instructional purposes. The term includes classrooms, 47 auditoriums, theaters, laboratories, hallways and restrooms. 48 Smoking policies applicable in the private offices of faculty and 49 staff and other "smoking permitted" space may be determined by 50 each academic and administrative department.

51 (2) No person shall smoke in any government building.
52 (3) No person shall smoke in any university or college
53 classroom building.

54 (4) The person, agency or entity having jurisdiction or 55 supervision over a government building or university/college 56 classroom building shall not allow smoking in the government or 57 university/college classroom building, and shall use reasonable 58 efforts to prevent smoking in such building, including, but not 59 limited to, the following:

61 invitees, guests and other persons that smoking is prohibited in
62 the building.

(b) Securing the removal of persons who smoke in thebuilding.

65 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 66 and after its passage.
