SENATE BILL NO. 2665

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 55-3-53, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE THE STATE FORESTER TO PROVIDE TIMBER CRUISE FOR EACH STATE PARK; TO REQUIRE THE STATE FORESTER TO DEVELOPMENT TIMBER MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR EACH STATE PARK; TO AMEND SECTION 55-3-54, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE PROCEEDS OF TIMBER SALE TO BE DEPOSITED INTO A SPECIAL ACCOUNT FOR THE PARK; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
 9 SECTION 1. Section 55-3-53, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
 10 amended as follows:

55-3-53. (1) The Mississippi Department of Wildlife, 11 Fisheries and Parks is hereby authorized and empowered to sell and 12 13 dispose of timber, trees, deadwood and stumps standing, growing and being upon the lands of state parks. Such timber shall be 14 sold and disposed of under the direction and specifications of the 15 State Forester in accordance with sound and efficient principles 16 17 of selective cutting, forestry management and conservation. The State Forester shall cruise the timber for each state park. 18

Before any such timber, trees, deadwood and stumps shall be sold, the <u>State Forester</u> shall select and mark the trees to be cut and disposed of. No trees or timber shall be marked for cutting when the cutting thereof would destroy or mar the scenic views from the tourist observation points in said park. The purchaser shall pay double price on sale basis for all trees, timber or stumps cut that had not been marked for removing *** * ***.

Before any such timber, trees, deadwood or stumps standing, growing or being upon such land shall be sold, the <u>State Forester</u> <u>and</u> the department shall advertise <u>the</u> intention so to do by publication in a newspaper published or having general circulation

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in the county or counties where parks are located, such notice to 30 31 be published at least once a week for three (3) consecutive weeks 32 preceding the sale and by posting one (1) notice in the courthouse in such county. The notice shall specify that such bids shall be 33 34 filed with the superintendent of the state park involved, who 35 shall transmit same to the State Forester and the Department of 36 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for rejection or approval. The 37 State Forester and the department shall accept the bid of the highest and best bidder for cash, but shall have the right to 38 39 reject any and all of such bids.

40 Provided, however, in the case of damage by fire, windstorm, 41 insects or other natural causes which would require immediate sale of the timber, because the time involved for advertisement as 42 43 prescribed herein would allow decay, rot or destruction substantially decreasing the purchase price to be received had not 44 45 such delay occurred, the advertisement provisions of this section 46 shall not apply. The State Park Director, upon a written recommendation from the county forester of the county wherein said 47 state park is located, shall determine when immediate sale of the 48 49 timber is required. When the State Park Director shall find an 50 immediate sale necessary for the causes stated herein, he shall, 51 in his discretion, set the time for receipt of bids on the 52 purchase of said timber, but shall show due diligence in notifying 53 competitive bidders so that a true competitive bid shall be 54 received.

55 Whenever any timber, trees, deadwood or stumps are sold under 56 the provisions of this section, the purchaser thereof shall have 57 all necessary rights of ingress and egress to enter upon said land 58 and cut and remove such timber, trees, deadwood or stumps. 59 The proceeds derived or received from all sales under the 50 provisions of this section shall be placed in the State Parks 51 Timber Management Endowment Fund created under Section 55-3-54.

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(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1) of this 62 section, the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks may cut 63 and sell trees damaged by fire, windstorm or insects and deadwood 64 65 and stumps located upon the lands of state parks for firewood. 66 Such firewood shall be sold only to overnight guests at state 67 parks for use at state parks. The Department of Wildlife, 68 Fisheries and Parks shall select and mark all trees to be cut for firewood. 69

70 SECTION 2. Section 55-3-54, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
71 amended as follows:

72 55 - 3 - 54. (1) There is created in the State Treasury a special fund to be known as the "State Parks Timber Management 73 74 Endowment Fund." The fund shall consist of all monies required to 75 be deposited therein under the provisions of Section 55-3-53. The 76 principal of the fund shall remain inviolate and shall be invested 77 as provided by law. Interest and income derived from investment 78 of the principal of the fund may be expended by the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, upon appropriation by 79 80 the Legislature, only for the purpose of constructing, 81 reconstructing, repairing, renovating or making improvements to 82 real and personal property and facilities on any of the state 83 parks under the jurisdiction and control of the Commission on 84 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the 85 86 State General Fund, and any interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited to the credit of the fund. 87

88 (2) After July 1, 2007, the department shall establish a special account within the fund for each state park from which 89 timber is harvested. The proceeds from the timber sale shall be 90 91 credited to park's account. The proceeds shall be disbursed to the park in addition to the park's annual budget. Any unexpended 92 93 funds remaining in an account shall not lapse into the fund but 94 shall remain in the account of the park. * SS01/ R514* S. B. No. 2665

95 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 96 and after July 1, 2007.
