COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2786

- 1 AN ACT TO CONSOLIDATE AND RECODIFY WILDLIFE LAWS PERTAINING TO WILD HOGS; TO AMEND SECTIONS 49-7-31.5 AND 49-7-33, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 2

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** (1) The hunting, taking and trapping of wild
- hogs shall be governed by this section, notwithstanding any 6
- provision of Sections 49-7-13, 49-7-31.5, 49-7-33 and 49-7-59 to 7
- 8 the contrary.
- 9 (2) Landowners, agricultural leaseholders or their
- designated agents may take wild hogs year-round on lands owned or 10
- 11 leased by them.
- (3) Landowners, agricultural leaseholders or their 12
- 13 designated agents may take wild hogs during the night after legal
- hunting hours, with or without the use of a light with a permit 14
- from the commission. The commission shall prescribe the permit 15
- and the weapons that may be used to take wild hogs after legal 16
- 17 hunting hours.
- 18 (4) (a) Wild hogs may be taken by the use of traps
- 19 year-round.
- (b) Landowners, agricultural leaseholders or their 20
- 21 designated agents may use bait to trap wild hogs as prescribed by
- the commission. 2.2
- (5) The meat of legally taken wild hogs may be bought and 23
- sold. 24
- 25 The commission may adopt regulations to control wild hog
- populations and to regulate the taking of wild hogs on public and 26
- 27 private lands.

- 28 **SECTION 2.** Section 49-7-31.5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 29 amended as follows:
- 49-7-31.5. (1) (a) The hunting of predatory and nuisance
- 31 animals shall be regulated by the * * * department.
- 32 (b) Landowners, agricultural leaseholders or their
- 33 designated agents may take predatory and nuisance animals
- 34 year-round on lands owned or leased by them.
- 35 (2) The taking of any animal or animals other than beavers,
- 36 nutria * * * or coyote by the use of a trap or traps is unlawful
- 37 except during the time the season is open for the taking of
- 38 fur-bearing animals.
- 39 (3) Fox and coyote may be run, chased or pursued with dogs,
- 40 except as provided in Section 49-7-32, year-round by licensed
- 41 hunters.
- 42 (4) It is unlawful to trap fox after the closed season for
- 43 trapping of other fur-bearing animals, except on property owned or
- 44 leased by the person trapping.
- 45 **SECTION 3.** Section 49-7-33, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 46 amended as follows:
- 47 49-7-33. (1) It is unlawful to hunt, trap or kill any wild
- 48 bird or wild animal of any kind with the aid of bait, recordings
- 49 of bird or animal calls, or electrically amplified imitations of
- 50 calls of any kind, except a person:
- 51 (a) May use electrically amplified sound devices for
- 52 hunting coyote and crow;
- (b) May use liquid scents for any animal or bird; and
- 54 (c) May use lures for trapping furbearing animals,
- 55 beaver, coyote, fox and nutria according to regulations adopted by
- 56 the commission.
- 57 (2) The commission, in its discretion, may relax the
- 58 restrictions regarding the use of lures or sound devices if a
- 59 condition arises or exists, as decided by the State Board of

- 60 Health or county board of health, that may endanger persons or
- 61 livestock in a certain community, county or area.
- 62 * * *
- 63 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 64 and after its passage.
