1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-41-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO DIRECT THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO ADOPT SCHOOL BUS SAFETY REQUIREMENTS WHICH INCORPORATE FEDERAL STANDARDS REGARDING THE USE OF COMPARTMENTALIZATION AND SEAT BELTS; TO DIRECT SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO COMPLY WITH SUCH SAFETY STANDARDS; TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO INSTALL AND RETROFIT SEAT BELTS AND SAFETY EQUIPMENT ON SCHOOL BUSES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
10	SECTION 1. Section 37-41-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
11	amended as follows:
12	37-41-1. (1) The State Board of Education is authorized,
13	empowered and directed to promulgate rules and regulations for:
14	(a) Setting standards for public school bus routes;
15	(b) Approving or disapproving plans for public school
16	routes;
17	(c) Setting standards for public school buses;
18	(d) Setting standards for public school bus drivers;
19	(e) Formulating procedure for selecting public school
20	bus drivers;
21	(f) Formulating courses of training for public school
22	bus drivers and mechanics, and assist in administering and
23	financing such courses;
24	(g) Providing operation procedure for public school
25	buses to insure safety of pupils;
26	(h) Furnishing consultative supervision for the

operation of county school bus garages, and approving plans for

such garages and the proposed expenditure of transportation funds

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therefor;

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30	(i) Formulating specifications for use in purchasing
31	public school buses; getting bids on public school buses;
32	equipment and supplies; and fixing prices based upon said bids
33	which school districts may not exceed in purchasing said
34	equipment;
35	(j) Formulating specifications for use by school
36	districts in purchasing used school buses;
37	(k) Providing a system of records and reports for the
38	purpose of carrying out the provisions of Sections 37-41-1 through
39	37-41-51, and providing the superintendent of schools with a
40	sufficient supply of report forms;
41	(1) Conduct upon said buses; and
42	(m) The method by which, and the circumstances in
43	which, any individual who is not a student scheduled to be a
44	passenger upon that particular bus, a member of the public school
45	administration or faculty, or a law enforcement official may
46	obtain entry upon said buses.
47	(2) The State Board of Education is authorized, empowered
48	and directed to promulgate rules and regulations setting safety
49	standards for school buses which incorporate at a minimum, the
50	recommendations of the National Highway Traffic Safety
51	Administration (NHTSA), as follows:
52	(a) For large school buses with a gross vehicle weight
53	rating over ten thousand (10,000) pounds, crash protection for
54	passengers shall be provided through compartmentalization, which
55	requires that the interior of the bus provides occupant protection
56	through strong, closely-spaced seats that have energy-absorbing
57	seat backs;
58	(b) For small school buses with a gross vehicle weight
59	rating under ten thousand (10,000) pounds, crash protection for
60	passengers shall be provided through lap or lap/shoulder belts at
61	all designated seating positions, and passengers shall be required
62	to buckle these belts when the bus is in motion;

63	(c) All school buses for physically handicapped
64	children shall be equipped with properly designed seat belts as
65	required in Section 37-41-3.
66	(d) School bus safety standards issued under this
67	paragraph shall be effective in the 2007-2008 school year for new
68	school buses purchased after July 1, 2007. The State Department
69	of Education shall provide funds for the proper seat belts and
70	safety equipment on school buses, from funds appropriated therefor
71	by the Legislature.
72	(3) (a) All rules and regulations adopted and promulgated
73	by the State Board of Education relating to school bus drivers
74	shall also be applicable to drivers of privately owned buses
75	transporting public school children.
76	(b) All rules and regulations adopted and promulgated
77	by the State Board of Education pursuant to the authority
78	conferred by this section shall be spread at large upon the
79	minutes of the State Board of Education and copies thereof shall
80	be furnished to all school boards not less than thirty (30) days
81	prior to the effective date of such rules and regulations.
82	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
83	and after July 1, 2007.
