COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2966

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 9-9-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO

GRANT TO COUNTIES OF A CERTAIN POPULATION SIZE THE OPTION TO 2 3 CREATE A COUNTY COURT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 9-9-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 5 amended as follows: 6 7 9-9-1. (1) There shall be an inferior court to be known as the county court in and for each of the following counties: 8 (a) Each county of the state wherein a county court is 9 in existence on July 1, 1985; * * * 10 (b) From and after January 1, 1987, each county that 11 12 has a population exceeding fifty thousand (50,000) inhabitants as shown by the latest federal decennial census; and 13 14 (c) The board of supervisors of any county having a population exceeding thirty-nine thousand (39,000) inhabitants as 15 shown by the latest federal decennial census in which Highways 589 16 and 98 intersect shall have the option to establish a county court 17 under the provisions of this section. 18 (a) A county judge for a county that is required to 19 (2) establish a county court under subsection (1)(b) of this section 20 shall be elected by the qualified electors of the county for the 21 same term and in the same manner as provided for the election of 2.2 circuit court judges at an election held at the same time as the 23 next regular election of circuit court judges first occurring 24 25 after the date upon which it can be determined that a county court is required under the provisions of subsection (1)(b) of this 26 27 section to be established in such county.

28 (b) A county judge for a county electing to establish a county court under subsection (1)(c) of this section shall be 29 30 elected by the qualified electors of the county in the same manner as provided for the election of circuit court judges at an 31 32 election held at the November general election first occurring after the date when the board of supervisors spreads upon its 33 minutes a resolution creating the county court. The term of the 34 county court judge so elected shall begin on the first day of 35 36 January following the November election, and shall end at the same time as for county court judges generally. Thereafter, the county 37 court judge shall be elected and serve for a term as provided for 38 39 county court judges generally. 40 The provisions of this section shall not be construed so (3)

41 as to require that a county court be established in any county in 42 which the board of supervisors has agreed and contracted with the 43 board of supervisors of any other county or counties to support 44 and maintain one (1) county court for such counties as provided in 45 Section 9-9-3.

46 SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi 47 shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, 48 or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the 49 Attorney General of the United States or to the United States 50 District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the 51 provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and 52 extended.

53 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 54 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting 55 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
