SENATE BILL NO. 3015 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 37-105-3 AND 37-29-275, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXPAND THE JURISDICTION OF LAW ENFORCEMENT 2 3 OFFICERS EMPLOYED AND DESIGNATED BY CERTAIN STATE UNIVERSITIES OR 4 PUBLIC COMMUNITY/JUNIOR COLLEGE TO INCLUDE THE AREA WITHIN 500 FEET OF UNIVERSITY OR COLLEGE PROPERTY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 37-105-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 8 amended as follows: 37-105-3. (1) The traffic officers duly appointed by the 9 president of any state institution of higher learning, or any 10 peace officer or highway patrolman of this state, are vested with 11 12 the powers and authority to perform all duties incident to enforcing such rules and regulations as may be enacted under the 13 authority granted in Section 37-105-1, including the arrest of 14 violators. 15 (2) The peace officers duly employed by Jackson State 16 University and the University of Southern Mississippi are also 17 vested with the powers and subjected to the duties of a constable 18 19 for the purpose of preventing all violations of law that occur within five hundred (500) feet of any property owned by the 20 21 university, if such universities determine that they want such peace officers to exercise such powers and if reasonably 2.2 determined to have a possible impact on the safety of students, 23 faculty or staff of the university while on said property. 24 Provided, however, that nothing in this section shall be 25 interpreted to require action by any such peace officer appointed 26 by such universities to events occurring outside the boundaries of 27

university property, nor shall any such university or its

- 31 Jackson State University and the University of Southern
- 32 Mississippi may enter into an interlocal agreement with other law
- 33 enforcement entities for the provision of equipment or traffic
- 34 control duties, however, the duty to enforce traffic regulations
- 35 and to enforce the laws of the state or municipality off of
- 36 university property lies with the local police or sheriff's
- 37 department which cannot withhold its services solely because of
- 38 the lack of such an agreement.
- 39 **SECTION 2.** Section 37-29-275, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 40 amended as follows:
- 41 37-29-275. Any act, which, if committed within the limits of
- 42 a city, town or village, or in any public place, would be a
- 43 violation of the general laws of this state, shall be criminal and
- 44 punishable if done on the campus, grounds or roads of any of the
- 45 state-supported junior colleges. The peace officers duly
- 46 appointed by the board of trustees of state-supported community or
- 47 junior colleges or officers of private security firms licensed by
- 48 the State of Mississippi contracted by the boards of trustees of
- 49 state supported community/junior colleges are vested with the
- 50 powers and subjected to the duties of a constable for the purpose
- of preventing and punishing all violations of law on
- 52 state-supported junior college grounds and for preserving order
- 53 and decorum thereon. Peace officers appointed by the boards of
- 54 trustees or officers of private security firms licensed by the
- 55 State of Mississippi contracted by the boards of trustees shall
- 56 have authority to bear arms in order to carry out their law
- 57 enforcement responsibilities if such officers have been certified
- 58 according to the minimum standards established by the Board on Law
- 59 Enforcement Officer Standards and Training. The peace officers
- 60 duly appointed by the boards of trustees of public
- 61 community/junior colleges are also vested with the powers and

62	subjected to the duties of a constable for the purpose of
63	preventing all violations of law that occur within five hundred
64	(500) feet of any property owned by the college, if reasonably
65	determined to have a possible impact on the safety of students,
66	faculty or staff of the college while on said property. Provided,
67	however, that nothing in this section shall be interpreted to
68	require action by any such peace officer appointed by a college to
69	events occurring outside the boundaries of college property, nor
70	shall any such college or its employees be liable for any failure
71	to act to any event occurring outside the boundaries of property
72	owned by the college. If a law enforcement officer is duly
73	appointed to be a peace officer by a college under this section,
74	the board of trustees of the public community/junior college may
75	enter into an interlocal agreement with other law enforcement
76	entities for the provision of equipment or traffic control duties,
77	however, the duty to enforce traffic regulations and to enforce
78	the laws of the state or municipality off of college property lies
79	with the local police or sheriff's department which cannot
80	withhold its services solely because of the lack of such an
81	agreement.
82	SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after July 1, 2007.
