SENATE BILL NO. 3137

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND COMMERCE, 2 3 FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2008. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of 8 defraying the expenses of the State Department of Agriculture and 9 Commerce, including the Divisions of Support, Plant Industry and Farmers Central Market, for the fiscal year beginning 10 11 July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008..... \$ 8,707,228.00. SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 12 necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special 13 source funds, which are collected by or otherwise become available 14 for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the State Department 15 of Agriculture and Commerce, including the Divisions of Support 16 and Plant Industry and Farmers Central Market, for the fiscal year 17 beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008..... 18\$ 5,557,956.00. 19 20 The funds authorized for expenditure under the provisions of 21 this section include subscription fees produced from the Market 2.2 Bulletin and admission fees produced from the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum. 23 24 SECTION 3. With the funds appropriated under the provisions 25 of Sections 1 and 2, the following positions are authorized: AUTHORIZED POSITIONS: 26 27 Full Time..... 191 Permanent:

Funds are provided herein to adjust the Variable Compensation Plan to ensure that all full-time employees receive a pay increase equal to the realignment component of the Variable Compensation Plan or One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or Three Percent (3%) whichever is greater, to be awarded on July 1, 2007.

With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 36 37 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 38 Services" for Fiscal Year 2009 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2008 39 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 40 41 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2009 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the 42 43 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 44 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 45 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 46 It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure act. 47 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 48 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2008 appropriation for "Personal 49 Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 50 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 51 52 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2008 "Personal Services" 53 54 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 55 56 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 57 such time as the requirements of this provision are met. Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 58

59 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 60 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State

Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

71 The agency shall not take any action to promote or otherwise 72 award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification, 73 realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, or any other 74 means to increase salaries of employees or positions unless 75 specifically exempted by the following conditions: the award of 76 teacher pay increases, the advancement of a trainee/cadet to the 77 next level of a bona fide career ladder, the award of an educational benchmark for the attainment of Certified Public 78 79 Accountant License or higher level professional certification as 80 determined by the State Personnel Board, the immediate replacement of a departing employee with an individual from within state 81 82 service or a new hire at a salary level equivalent to that of the 83 departing employee, and the emergency appointment of nurses, pharmacists or other health care professionals at a salary to be 84 85 determined by the State Personnel Board, unless otherwise authorized in this act. 86

87 SECTION 4. The funds appropriated and authorized to be 88 expended under the provisions of this act shall be expended for 89 the purpose of defraying all expenses incurred by the State 90 Department of Agriculture and Commerce in the operation of all 91 programs and activities (except operation of the State Lime 92 Plants, Veterinary Laboratory, Pink Bollworm-Plant Quarantine 93 Inspection Stations and Fire Ant Program) authorized to be

94 conducted and carried on by said department; including, but not 95 limited to: the administration of the Feed, Fertilizer and Dairy 96 Act; the Weights and Measure Act; the Meat Inspection Act of 1968; 97 the Mississippi Pure Seed Law; and the following additional 98 programs and activities: enforcement of the egg law; publication 99 and distribution of the Mississippi Market Bulletin, agricultural 100 statistics, market news service at Stoneville, Mississippi; and 101 inspection, grading and certifying of fruits, vegetables, hay, 102 grain, meat and meat products, milk and dairy products, pecans, 103 seed and syrup.

104 SECTION 5. The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and 105 Commerce, with the assistance of the State Department of Audit and 106 the Department of Finance and Administration, shall establish nonbudgeted enterprise funds for all "for profit" activities 107 related to the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum. 108 The 109 funds shall be maintained in accordance with generally accepted 110 accounting principles and regulations prescribed by the Department 111 of Finance and Administration.

SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the State Department of Agriculture and Commerce is hereby authorized to accept, budget and expend funds from any source in accordance with rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds.

118 SECTION 7. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 119 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 120 Treasury to the credit of the Beaver Control Program or from any other special source funds made available to the Beaver Control 121 Program, to the Department of Agriculture and Commerce for the 122 123 support of the Beaver Control Program for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008..... 124\$ 700,000.00. 125

Of the special funds authorized in this section, Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be derived from funds received from the Mississippi Department of Transportation and Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be derived from counties and from fees charged private persons/organizations, and Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) shall be derived from funds received from the State Forestry Commission.

SECTION 8. Of the funds provided by the provisions of this 133 act, it is the intent of the Legislature that not more than Thirty 134 135 Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) shall be expended for the Mississippi Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Pilot Program, which 136 137 shall be established by the State Department of Agriculture and 138 Commerce to serve senior citizens above sixty (60) years of age 139 who fall within one hundred thirty percent (130%) of the poverty The Commissioner of Agriculture may promulgate rules and 140 level. 141 regulations necessary to implement the Mississippi Senior Farmers' 142 Market Nutrition Pilot Program.

143 **SECTION 9.** Of the funds appropriated herein, not more than 144 Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) is provided, for the 145 purpose of making incentive payments to producers of ethanol 146 utilizing Mississippi-produced agriculture commodities under the 147 provisions of Section 69-51-5, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the State Department of Agriculture and Commerce shall have the authority to escalate its budget and expend funds from any source not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) in accordance with rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds.

155 **SECTION 11.** It is the intention of the Legislature that 156 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 157 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 158 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,

quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are made without competitive bids.

163 **SECTION 12.** It is legislative intent to ensure beneficial 164 information reaches as many Mississippians as possible. Further, 165 it is legislative intent that the expenditure of public funds for 166 this purpose be accomplished in an efficient and effective manner.

167 Therefore, state agencies as standard procedure, will observe 168 the following criteria:

169 (1) Develop goals and desired result for a campaign.

170 (2) Evaluate effectiveness through respected advertising171 standards, including market reach and cost effectiveness.

172 (3) Seek public service announcements, which would be aired173 by media without cost.

174 (4) Itemize and justify professional assistance and related 175 expenses for creative and production costs outside of the actual 176 media expenditures.

Utilize Mississippi owned media companies when feasible.
SECTION 13. Of the funds provided under the provisions of
this act, Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) shall be provided
to the Fair Commission County Livestock Shows for prize money.

181 SECTION 14. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 182 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 183 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 184 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 185 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 186 proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law. SECTION 15. This act shall take effect and be in force from 187 188 and after July 1, 2007.
