9	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008

11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi
14	Department of Corrections which is collected by or otherwise
15	become available for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the
16	Department, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, and ending
17	June 30, 2008\$ 16,741,471.00.
18	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of

280	SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2,
281	none shall be expended for personnel housing under the
282	jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections unless the
283	department shall collect a reasonable rent, after a finding of
284	fact as to what is a reasonable rent, and/or the cost of utilities
285	furnished to said housing. The Department of Corrections shall
286	not pay for the installation or monthly service of any telephone
287	installed in a staff residence under its jurisdiction.
288	SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2,
289	and authorized for expenditure in Section 3, payment may be
290	authorized for court ordered attorney fees and any accrued

- 291 interest subject to the approval of the Office of the Attorney
- 292 General.
- 293 **SECTION 7.** No part of the funds herein appropriated shall be
- 294 used for the purpose of returning escaped state convicts to the
- 295 State Penitentiary from a distance of over one hundred (100) miles
- 296 beyond the borders of the state, except upon approval of the
- 297 Governor in each specific case.
- 298 **SECTION 8.** None of the money herein appropriated shall be
- 299 paid to any person who by the provision of Section 47-5-47,
- 300 Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, is prohibited from being an
- 301 employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections. The State
- 302 Department of Finance and Administration shall at least annually
- 303 make a report to the Joint Legislative Committee on Performance
- 304 Evaluation and Expenditure Review and to the Attorney General
- 305 stating the name of any person prohibited under the provisions of
- 306 Section 47-5-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, from being
- 307 an employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections who has
- 308 during the preceding year received any money herein appropriated.
- 309 In the event that any such person prohibited as herein above
- 310 provided from receiving funds herein appropriated should receive
- 311 any of said funds, the Attorney General shall immediately commence
- 312 action to recover the monies so paid to said person and to enjoin
- 313 the further employment of said person at the Mississippi
- 314 Department of Corrections.
- 315 **SECTION 9.** It is the intent of the Legislature that all
- 316 prisoners at Parchman shall work a minimum of eight (8) hours per
- 317 day, excluding prisoners with a physical disability or those
- 318 incarcerated in maximum security.
- 319 **SECTION 10.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 320 Department of Corrections shall have the authority to accept,
- 321 budget and expend any special funds collected or otherwise
- 322 available, through the sell of scrap or recycled material, for the

323 purpose of providing recycling equipment, supplies or services for 324 use within the department. SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 325 326 per diem rates paid to regional facilities shall not exceed 327 Twenty-nine Dollars and Seventy-four Cents (\$29.74) per inmate. 328 All regional facilities shall continue to receive the annual three 329 percent (3%) increase in the per diem rate as authorized in Section 47-5-933, Mississippi Code of 1972, however, in no event 330 shall any regional facility's per diem rate exceed Twenty-nine 331 332 Dollars and Seventy-four Cents (\$29.74) per inmate. 333 SECTION 12. The department or its contracted medical 334 provider will pay to a provider of a medical service for any and all incarcerated persons from a correctional or detention facility 335 an amount based upon negotiated fees as agreed to by the medical 336 care service providers and the department and/or its contracted 337 338 medical provider. In the absence of negotiated discounted fee 339 schedule, medical care service providers will be paid by the department or its contracted medical service provider an amount no 340 341 greater than the reimbursement rate applicable based on the 342 Mississippi Medicaid reimbursement rate. This limitation applies 343 to all medical care services, durable and nondurable goods, 344 prescription drugs and medications provided to any and all 345 incarcerated persons outside of the correctional or detention 346 facility. 347 SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 348 Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of Corrections shall 349 have the authority to transfer cash from one special fund treasury 350 fund to another special fund treasury fund under the control of the Department of Corrections. The purpose of this authority is 351 352 to more efficiently use available cash reserves. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the Department of 353 354 Corrections shall submit written justification for the transfer to 355 the Legislative Budget Office and the Department of Finance and

- 356 Administration on or before the fifteenth (15th) of the month
- 357 prior to the effective date of the transfer.
- 358 **SECTION 14.** The Commissioner of the Mississippi Department
- 359 of Corrections is hereby authorized to transfer spending authority
- 360 between and within budgets, both positions and funds, in an amount
- 361 not to exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the authorized budgets
- 362 in the aggregate. It is further the intention of the Legislature
- 363 that the Department of Corrections shall submit written
- 364 justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office
- 365 and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the
- 366 fifteenth (15th) of the month prior to the effective date of the
- 367 transfer. However, no transfers shall be authorized which
- 368 increase the major object of expenditure "Salaries, Wages and
- 369 Fringe Benefits" in any budget authorized in Section 3 of this
- 370 act.
- 371 **SECTION 15.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 372 Mississippi Department of Corrections shall have the authority to
- 373 receive, budget, and expend funds from any source, including
- 374 beginning cash in excess of beginning cash when spending authority
- 375 was initially appropriated, that may become available to the
- 376 department in accordance with the rules and regulations of the
- 377 Department of Finance and Administration in a matter consistent
- 378 with the escalation of federal funds.
- 379 **SECTION 16.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 380 Department of Corrections shall have the authority to accept,
- 381 budget and expend any portion of confiscated funds received in
- 382 conjunction with its participating in investigations of illegal
- 383 activities of any offender under the supervision of the agency.
- 384 These funds shall be used to provide security enhancement within
- 385 the Department of Corrections.
- 386 **SECTION 17.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 387 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 388 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things

- 389 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 390 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 391 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 392 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 393 made without competitive bids.
- 394 **SECTION 18.** It is legislative intent to ensure beneficial
- 395 information reaches as many Mississippians as possible. Further,
- 396 it is legislative intent that the expenditure of public funds for
- 397 this purpose be accomplished in an efficient and effective manner.
- 398 Therefore, state agencies as standard procedure, will observe
- 399 the following criteria:
- 400 (a) Develop goals and desired result for a campaign.
- 401 (b) Evaluate effectiveness through respected
- 402 advertising standards, including market reach and cost
- 403 effectiveness.
- 404 (c) Seek public service announcements, which would be
- 405 aired by media without cost.
- 406 (d) Itemize and justify professional assistance and
- 407 related expenses for creative and production costs outside of the
- 408 actual media expenditures.
- 409 (e) Utilize Mississippi owned media companies when
- 410 feasible.
- 411 **SECTION 19.** The department is authorized to expend available
- 412 funds on technology or equipment upgrades or replacements when it
- 413 will generate savings through efficiency or when the savings
- 414 generated from such upgrades or replacements exceed expenditures
- 415 thereof.
- 416 **SECTION 20.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 417 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 418 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 419 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 420 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 421 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

422 **SECTION 21.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 423 and after July 1, 2007.
