The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 7 Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Workers' Compensation Commission, for the purpose of defraying the expenses incurred by 8 said commission for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, and 9 ending June 30, 2008..... \$ 6,300,312.00. 10 11 SECTION 2. Funds are provided herein to adjust the Variable Compensation Plan to ensure that all full-time employees receive a pay increase equal to the realignment component of the Variable Compensation Plan or One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or Three Percent (3%) whichever is greater, to be awarded on July 1, 2007.

With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 38 39 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 40 Services" for Fiscal Year 2009 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2008 41 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 42 43 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2009 budget by the 44 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the 45 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 46 47 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 48 act. 49 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 50 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2008 appropriation for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 51 52 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 53 54 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2008 "Personal Services" 55 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 56 57 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 58 59 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

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Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 60 61 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 62 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 63 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 64 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 65 66 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 67 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 68 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

73 The agency shall not take any action to promote or otherwise award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification, 74 75 realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, or any other 76 means to increase salaries of employees or positions unless 77 specifically exempted by the following conditions: the award of 78 teacher pay increases, the advancement of a trainee/cadet to the 79 next level of a bona fide career ladder, the award of an educational benchmark for the attainment of Certified Public 80 81 Accountant License or higher level professional certification as 82 determined by the State Personnel Board, the immediate replacement of a departing employee with an individual from within state 83 84 service or a new hire at a salary level equivalent to that of the 85 departing employee, and the emergency appointment of nurses, 86 pharmacists or other health care professionals at a salary to be determined by the State Personnel Board, unless otherwise 87 88 authorized in this act.

89 SECTION 3. It is the intention of the Legislature that with 90 the funds appropriated in Section 1 and authorized for expenditure 91 in Section 2, the Mississippi Workers' Compensation Commission 92 shall enter into a contract with the industrial private sector for S. B. No. 3165 *SS05/A521* 07/SS05/A521 PAGE 3 93 the purpose of implementing a safety education and training 94 program.

95 **SECTION 4.** With the funds provided herein, it is the intent 96 of the Legislature that the Workers' Compensation Commission may 97 transfer a sum or sums not to exceed Two Hundred Thousand Dollars 98 (\$200,000.00) from the Administrative Expense Fund to the Second 99 Injury Fund.

SECTION 5. With the funds provided herein, it is the intent of the Legislature that the Workers' Compensation Commission may transfer a sum or sums not to exceed One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) from the Administrative Expense Fund to the Insurance Integrity Enforcement Bureau within the Office of the Attorney General.

106 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that 107 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 108 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 109 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 110 111 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 112 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 113 made without competitive bids.

114 SECTION 7. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 115 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 116 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 117 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 118 119 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 120 SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2007. 121
