SENATE BILL NO. 3203

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE GOVERNING AUTHORITIES OF THE CITY OF 1 2 BAY SPRINGS, MISSISSIPPI TO LEVY A TAX UPON THE GROSS SALES OF 3 RESTAURANTS IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED 2% OF GROSS SALES OF 4 BEVERAGES SOLD FOR ON-PREMISES CONSUMPTION AND PREPARED FOOD FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FUNDS TO REDUCE THE INDEBTEDNESS INCURRED 5 AND TO BE INCURRED BY THE CITY IN FUNDING THE PURCHASE OF LAND AND 6 7 THE CONSTRUCTION OF A SPORTS COMPLEX CONSISTING OF BASEBALL 8 FIELDS, SOCCER FIELDS, WALKING TRAILS AND OTHER ATHLETIC 9 FACILITIES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11 SECTION 1. As used in this act, the following terms shall have the following meanings unless a different meaning is clearly 12 indicated by the context in which they are used: 13 14 (a) "Governing authorities" means the governing authorities of the City of Bay Springs, Mississippi. 15 16 (b) "Restaurant" means all places where prepared food and beverages are sold for consumption, whether such food is 17 consumed on the premises or not. "Restaurant" as defined herein 18 does not include any school, hospital, convalescent or nursing 19 20 home, or any restaurant-like facility operated by or in connection with a school, hospital, medical clinic, convalescent or nursing 21 home providing food for students, patients, visitors and their 22 23 families. SECTION 2. (1) For the purpose of providing funds to reduce 24 the indebtedness incurred and to be incurred by the City of Bay 25 Springs in funding the purchase of land and the construction of a 26 sports complex consisting of baseball fields, soccer fields, 27 walking trails and other athletic facilities, the governing 28 authorities are authorized, in their discretion, to levy and 29 30 collect from the persons hereinafter specified a tax, which shall

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31 be in addition to all of the taxes and assessments imposed. The 32 tax shall be imposed upon every person, firm or corporation 33 operating a restaurant or such other business, where prepared food 34 or beverages are sold to the public in the City of Bay Springs, 35 Mississippi, at a rate not to exceed two percent (2%) of the gross 36 proceeds of the sales of beverages sold for on-premises 37 consumption and prepared food.

38 (2) Persons, firms or corporations liable for the levy 39 imposed under subsection (1) of this section shall add the amount 40 of the levy to the sales price of the products set out herein and 41 shall collect, insofar as is practicable, the amount of the tax 42 due by them from the person receiving the services or product at 43 the time of payment therefor.

(3) Such tax shall be collected by and paid to the
Mississippi State Tax Commission on a form prescribed by the State
Tax Commission in the manner that state sales taxes are computed,
collected and paid; and full enforcement provisions and all other
provisions of Chapter 65, Title 27, Mississippi Code of 1972,
shall apply as necessary to the implementation and administration
of this act.

51 (4) The proceeds of such tax, less three percent (3%) 52 thereof which shall be retained by the State Tax Commission to 53 defray the cost of collection, shall be paid to the governing 54 authorities of the City of Bay Springs, Mississippi, on or before 55 the fifteenth day of the month following the month in which 56 collected.

57 (5) The proceeds of such tax shall not be considered by the 58 City of Bay Springs as general fund revenues but shall be 59 dedicated to and expended solely for the purposes specified in 60 this section.

61 SECTION 3. Before any tax authorized under this act may be 62 imposed, the governing authorities shall adopt a resolution 63 declaring their intention to levy the tax, setting forth the S. B. No. 3203 \*SS26/R1327.1\* 07/SS26/R1327.1

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amount of the tax to be imposed, the date upon which the tax shall 64 65 become effective and calling for an election to be held on the 66 question. The date of the election shall be fixed in the 67 resolution. Notice of such intention and the election shall be 68 published once each week for at least three (3) consecutive weeks 69 in a newspaper published or having a general circulation in the 70 City of Bay Springs, with the first publication of the notice to be made not less than twenty-one (21) days before the date fixed 71 in the resolution for the election and the last publication to be 72 73 made not more than seven (7) days before the election. At the 74 election, all qualified electors of the City of Bay Springs may vote, and the ballots used in the election shall have printed 75 76 thereon a brief statement of the amount and purposes of the proposed tax levy and the words "FOR THE TAX" and, on a separate 77 line, "AGAINST THE TAX" and the voters shall vote by placing a 78 cross (X) or check  $(\sqrt{)}$  opposite their choice on the proposition. 79 80 When the results of the election shall have been canvassed and 81 certified, the city may levy the tax if sixty percent (60%) of the 82 qualified electors who vote in the election vote in favor of the 83 At least thirty (30) days before the effective date of the tax. 84 tax provided in this section, the governing authorities shall 85 furnish to the State Tax Commission a certified copy of the 86 resolution evidencing the tax.

87 SECTION 4. Accounting for receipts and expenditures of the 88 funds herein described shall be made separately from the accounting of receipts and expenditures of the general fund and 89 90 any other funds of the City of Bay Springs, Mississippi. The records reflecting the receipts and expenditures of the funds 91 prescribed herein shall be audited annually by an independent 92 93 certified public accountant, and the accountant shall make a written report of his audit to the governing authorities. 94 The 95 audit shall be made and completed as soon as practicable after the

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98 **SECTION 5.** The provisions of this act shall be repealed from 99 and after July 1, 2012.

SECTION 6. The governing authorities of the City of Bay Springs are directed to submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the Attorney General of the United States or to the United States District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.

107 **SECTION 7.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 108 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting 109 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
