SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 555

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING 1 MISSISSIPPI STATE TREASURER TATE REEVES FOR HIS ELECTION AS 2 3 PRESIDENT OF THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF STATE TREASURERS (NAST). 4 WHEREAS, Mississippi State Treasurer Tate Reeves was named 5 the President of the National Association of State Treasurers (NAST) on December 1, 2006. In March 2006, Reeves had been 6 7 elected Senior Vice President of NAST, which put him in line to become the next President; and 8

9 WHEREAS, Tate Reeves has been actively involved in the 10 association since his swearing in as Mississippi's Treasurer in 11 January 2004. Reeves was nominated for the position from a group 12 of his peers representing the Southern State Treasurers. Reeves 13 was sworn into his position at the NAST Treasury Management 14 Conference in New Orleans, Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, the National Association of State Treasurers, 15 founded in 1976, is an organization of state financial leaders. 16 17 NAST membership is composed of all State Treasurers, or state 18 finance officials with comparable responsibilities, from the United States, its commonwealths, territories and the District of 19 20 Columbia. NAST is recognized as a national force whose work has influenced public policy at both the state and federal levels. 21 2.2 NAST is instrumental in developing and promoting standards of excellence regarding ethical conduct, policy guidelines and 23 24 accountability, and model legislation and regulations; and 25 WHEREAS, "It is an honor to be elected to the leadership of this prestigious organization by a bipartisan group of my peers," 26 27 said Reeves. "NAST plays an important policy-setting role at the

state and national levels. I am very pleased to have the opportunity to work on issues vital to financial policy in all 50 states while providing a voice for Mississippi at this critical time in our history"; and

32 WHEREAS, Tate Reeves was elected as Mississippi's 53rd 33 Treasurer on November 4, 2003. Currently, Treasurer Reeves is the 34 youngest State Treasurer serving in the country and the youngest 35 statewide elected official in Mississippi. He is also the first 36 Republican Treasurer in the state's history; and

37 WHEREAS, Tate is a Rankin County native and a graduate of Florence High School. He is an honors graduate of Millsaps 38 39 College and holds a Bachelor's degree in Economics. While at Millsaps, he played point guard for the Millsaps Majors basketball 40 41 team. Tate has continued to be an active alumnus and remains involved with his alma mater by serving as a member of the 42 43 Investment Policy Board for the Millsaps College General Louis 44 Wilson Fund; and

45 WHEREAS, prior to becoming Treasurer, Tate was a member of the Trustmark Investment Strategy Committee and served as an 46 47 Assistant Vice President for AmSouth, formerly known as Deposit Guaranty National Bank. He holds the Chartered Financial Analyst 48 49 designation (CFA). Tate is also a member of the CFA Society of 50 Mississippi and is a member of the CFA Institute, an organization that leads the investment industry by setting the highest 51 52 standards of ethics and professional excellence. In 1996, he was 53 the recipient of the Mississippi Society of Financial Analysts 54 Award; and

55 WHEREAS, Tate currently serves as Chairman of the Investment 56 Committee and as a member of the Board of Directors of the Public 57 Employees' Retirement System (PERS) of Mississippi. Tate also 58 serves as Chairman of the Board of Directors of the College 59 Savings Plans of Mississippi and the Health Care Trust Fund; and

WHEREAS, Tate and his wife Elee Williams Reeves, a Tylertown 60 61 native, are the proud parents of one daughter, Sarah Tyler. 62 Currently, the Reeves family attends Galloway Memorial United Methodist Church, where Elee and Tate serve as Co-Chairman of the 63 64 2006 Capital Campaign. They have been very committed to many civic and charitable organizations in Mississippi, including the 65 66 Mississippi Society of Disabilities, UMC Children's Cancer Clinic, Middle Mississippi Girl Scout Council, Boys & Girls Club of 67 Mississippi, Stewpot Ministries, the Exchange Club Parent Child 68 69 Center, and the Mississippi Symphony Orchestra. In addition, Tate 70 is currently serving as the 2006 State Chairman for the United Way 71 and as a member of the YMCA Finance Committee; and

72 WHEREAS, this a great honor for Mississippi and well-deserved 73 recognition for Tate Reeves, who is playing a major role in the 74 State of Mississippi's retention of its favorable bond rating in 75 the wake of Hurricane Katrina, and ensuring that Mississippi 76 remains fiscally strong:
