SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 562

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION DESIGNATING APRIL 28 THROUGH MAY 6, 2 2007, AS "NATIONAL SAFE KIDS WEEK" IN MISSISSIPPI. 3 WHEREAS, unintentional injury is the number one killer of 4 children ages 14 and under; and 5 WHEREAS, each year, more than 5,000 children ages 14 and under die from unintentional injuries; and 6 7 WHEREAS, emergency rooms experience nearly 2.4 million visits from children ages 14 and under each summer; and 8 WHEREAS, 90% of these are preventable; and 9 10 WHEREAS, 41% of these deaths occur during "Trauma Season," the months of May, June, July, and August; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the risk areas which show the greatest seasonal surge in deaths and injuries between May and August, compared to 13 14 the rest of the year, are biking, drowning, pedestrian, motor 15 vehicle occupants and falls; and 16 WHEREAS, Safe Kids Worldwide and Safe Kids Mississippi promotes childhood injury prevention by uniting diverse groups 17 into local and state coalitions, developing innovative educational 18 tools and strategies, initiating public policy changes, promoting 19 20 new technology and raising awareness through the media; and 21 WHEREAS, Safe Kids Worldwide, with the support of founding sponsor Johnson & Johnson, launches National Safe Kids Week 2007, 22 "Make it a Safe Summer," which focuses on five of the deadliest 23 warm weather risk areas of motor vehicles, drownings, pedestrian, 24 25 biking and falls; and WHEREAS, Safe Kids Mississippi has planned special childhood 26 27 injury prevention activities and community-based events for Safe * SS01/ R1343* S.
