- 2 TENNIS COACH LYNN WOOD UPON HIS INDUCTION INTO THE 2006
- 3 MISSISSIPPI ASSOCIATION OF COACHES HALL OF FAME.
- WHEREAS, on July 7, 2006, 41-year veteran Corinth Tennis
- 5 Coach Lynn Wood and four other coaches were honored at the 34th
- 6 Mississippi Association of Coaches Hall of Fame Induction and
- 7 Awards Banquet in Jackson, Mississippi; and
- 8 WHEREAS, since 1972, the Lexington, Tennessee, native has
- 9 directed the Corinth High School tennis team to 11 State
- 10 Championships and 26 event titles; and
- 11 WHEREAS, for coaches and athletic directors a minimum of 25
- 12 years of service are required by the Mississippi Association of
- 13 Coaches at a Mississippi Junior High School, Mississippi High
- 14 School or Mississippi Community/Junior College. In addition,
- 15 nominees must have made an outstanding contribution to the
- 16 profession and be dedicated to the athletes and to the sport(s) he
- 17 is coaching; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Coach Wood has played a strong role in tennis
- 19 outside of Corinth's state titles. He has been a member of the
- 20 Tennis Committee since its inception, even serving as the Chairman
- 21 until 2000, helped start the All-Star Game in 1995 and for good
- 22 measure runs the Juniors portion of the Candy Classic; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Coach Wood earned degrees at Bethel College and
- 24 Middle Tennessee State University before entering the education
- 25 field in 1965. He taught and assisted in football and basketball
- 26 for one year at Southside Jr. High in Jacksonville, Florida,

27 before moving to then-Ramer High School in McNairy County,
```

- 28 Tennessee, for a one-year stint in 1966; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Coach Wood began what would be a 38-year teaching
- 30 career at Corinth in the fall of 1967. This move would be his
- 31 last. He taught Biology, Physical Science and then Earth Science
- 32 until ending a 40-year teaching career on June 30, 2005; and
- 33 WHEREAS, upon arriving at Corinth, Wood worked with the
- 34 junior high football program and assisted James A. Horton on the
- 35 hardwood. He didn't begin to build his Hall of Fame résumé until
- 36 the spring of 1972 when Horton, who later became the school's
- 37 winningest coach on the hardwood, stepped aside as tennis coach;
- 38 and
- 39 WHEREAS, "Back in those days you had to be really tough,"
- 40 said Wood. "There was no classification for tennis and all the
- 41 school's that had a team in the district were thrown together.
- 42 You had to be really good to get out"; and
- WHEREAS, the initial trip in 1974 wouldn't be Wood's last.
- 44 Since then, 1976 is the only year in which Corinth High School
- 45 wasn't represented by at least one event in the state tournament;
- 46 and
- WHEREAS, Corinth began its tennis dominance in 1981. In
- 48 those 26 seasons, the Warriors and Lady Warriors have claimed 15
- 49 district/division titles, 11 state titles and 26 event
- 50 championships. In winning its first championship, Corinth High
- 51 School also set school records with 17 points and three-event
- 52 titles. Those marks, although since tied twice, have stood the
- 53 test of time. Corinth High School claimed seven straight team
- 54 titles and 14 event championships from 1986-1992; and
- 55 WHEREAS, in May of 2006, Corinth High School successfully
- 56 defended its title -- winning for the third time in five years --
- 57 with a record-tying 17 points and three-event championships; and
- WHEREAS, a handful of Mississippi Association of Coaches Hall
- of Famers have ties to Corinth High School, but Wood is believed

- 61 Coach. Wood might have retired from teaching, but he's planning
- 62 on continuing his other interest -- officiating football, which
- 63 also began in 1972; and
- WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we recognize the
- 65 enthusiasm of this legendary tennis coach who has brought honor to
- 66 his school, his community and to the State of Mississippi:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 68 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
- 69 we do hereby commend and congratulate Corinth High School Tennis
- 70 Coach Lynn Wood upon his induction into the 2006 Mississippi
- 71 Association of Coaches Hall of Fame and extend to him and his
- 72 family the best wishes of the Legislature on his future endeavors.
- 73 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to
- 74 Coach Wood and be forwarded to the Principal of Corinth High
- 75 School and be made available to the Capitol Press Corps.
