SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 628

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION DESIGNATING THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER 2007 AS "MISSISSIPPI ALCOHOL AND DRUG ADDICTION RECOVERY MONTH" 2 3 AND URGING ALL CITIZENS TO PARTICIPATE IN AWARENESS ACTIVITIES. 4 WHEREAS, 74% of Americans say that addiction to alcohol has 5 had some impact on them at some point in their lives, whether it was their own personal addiction, that of a friend or family 6 7 member, or any other experience with addiction. A 63% majority of 8 Americans also say that addiction to either drugs or alcohol has 9 had a great impact on their lives; and

WHEREAS, Recovery Month is sponsored by the Substance Abuse 10 11 and Mental Health Services Administration's (SAMHSA's) Center for Substance Abuse Treatment (CSAT). CSAT, created in October 1992 12 13 by a Congressional mandate, provides national leadership in the Federal government's effort to improve the lives of individuals 14 15 and their families affected by alcohol and drug abuse. CSAT works to improve access to clinically sound, cost-effective addiction 16 treatment to reduce the health and social cost to our communities 17 18 and the nation. Such factors as inadequate capacity, limited public and private health insurance benefits and stigma have 19 20 contributed to the gap between the number of people who need treatment and the number who receive it; and 21

22 WHEREAS, Recovery Month is an annual observance that takes 23 place during the month of September. The Recovery Month 24 observance highlights the societal benefits of substance abuse 25 treatment, lauds the contributions of treatment providers and 26 promotes the message that recovery from substance abuse in all its 27 forms is possible. The observance also encourages citizens to

take action to help expand and improve the availability of 28 29 effective substance abuse treatment for those in need. Each year a new theme, or emphasis, is selected for the observance; and 30 WHEREAS, stigma and discrimination present obstacles and can 31 32 be a mark of disgrace to those with substance use disorders who 33 need access to treatment facilities, and for those who want to 34 reestablish their place in the community by entering the 35 workforce; and

36 WHEREAS, educating our community about how substance use 37 disorders affect children, families and all community members is 38 essential to overcoming stigma and discrimination; and

39 WHEREAS, we must recognize the achievement of those who seek 40 out treatment services and ensure that such services are readily 41 available to those who need assistance; and

42 WHEREAS, substance use disorders are a treatable, yet serious 43 health care problem, and we can take steps to address it and so 44 build a stronger, healthier community; and

45 WHEREAS, this year's Recovery Month theme, "Join the Voices 46 for Recovery: Build a Stronger, Healthier Community," encourages 47 us all to learn about how we can help those suffering from 48 substance use disorders receive treatment, so we can strengthen 49 our community; and

50 WHEREAS, to help achieve this goal, the U.S. Department of 51 Health and Human Services, the Substance Abuse and Mental Health 52 Services Administration Center for Substance Abuse Treatment 53 (CSAT), the White House Office of National Drug Control Policy and 54 the Mississippi Department of Mental Health invite all residents 55 of Mississippi to participate in Mississippi Alcohol and Drug 56 Addiction Recovery Month:

57 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF 58 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That 59 we do hereby designate the month of September 2007 as "Mississippi 60 Alcohol and Drug Addiction Recovery Month," and encourage all 5.
