SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 641

- 1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A TASK FORCE TO STUDY
- 2 THE INCREASED INFRASTRUCTURE AND PUBLIC SAFETY COSTS AND NEEDS
- 3 INCURRED BY THE CITY OF JACKSON AS A RESULT OF BEING THE SEAT OF
- 4 STATE GOVERNMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 6 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN,
- 7 That:
- 8 (1) There is hereby created a Task Force to Study the
- 9 Increased Infrastructure and Public Safety Costs and Needs
- 10 Incurred by the City of Jackson as a result of Being the Seat of
- 11 State Government. The task force shall be composed of seven (7)
- 12 members as follows:
- 13 (a) Three (3) members appointed by the Governor, each
- 14 of whom shall represent the interest of business, law enforcement
- 15 and the general public;
- 16 (b) Three (3) members appointed by the Mayor of the
- 17 City of Jackson, each of whom shall represent the interest of law
- 18 enforcement, transportation and the general public;
- 19 (c) One (1) member appointed by the Lieutenant
- 20 Governor, who shall represent the interest of state government;
- 21 and
- 22 (d) One (1) member appointed by the Speaker of the
- 23 House of Representatives, who shall represent the interest of the
- 24 Legislature.
- 25 (2) The task force shall develop a study and make
- 26 recommendations with any necessary legislation to the Legislature
- 27 and the Governor on the increased infrastructure and public safety
- 28 costs and needs incurred by the City of Jackson as a result of

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- 29 being the Seat of State Government. The task force shall
- 30 specifically examine the needs and increased costs associated with
- 31 the Capitol Complex in downtown Jackson, the area surrounding the
- 32 State Fairgrounds, the area surrounding the campus of Jackson
- 33 State University and the area surrounding the University of
- 34 Mississippi Medical Center/Mississippi Memorial Stadium. The
- 35 report shall examine all aspects of the needs of law enforcement,
- 36 transportation, utilities, economic development and ad valorem tax
- 37 exemption, associated with the specific areas of the city
- 38 mentioned above. The task force shall issue its report to the
- 39 Legislature and the Governor on or before December 1, 2007, and
- 40 upon the presentation of the report the task force shall be
- 41 dissolved.
- 42 (3) All members of the task force shall be designated or
- 43 appointed in accordance with subsection (1) above and shall be so
- 44 designated or appointed in sufficient time so as to allow for all
- 45 members of the task force to be identified prior to the first
- 46 meeting of the task force.
- 47 (4) The first meeting of the task force shall take place no
- 48 later than July 1, 2007, on the call of the Governor at a place
- 49 designated by him. At the first meeting of the task force, the
- 50 members shall elect a chairman and a vice chairman from its
- 51 membership. Following the election of the chairman and the vice
- 52 chairman, the task force shall adopt rules for transacting its
- 53 business and keeping records. Members of the task force shall
- 54 serve without compensation.
- 55 (5) The Department of Finance and Administration shall
- 56 provide appropriate staff support and shall designate an
- 57 appropriate employee to act as a point of contact for the
- 58 provision of staff support to the task force. All other agencies,
- 59 departments, offices and institutions of the state, including all
- 60 state universities and community and junior colleges, shall

- 61 cooperate with the task force and provide such assistance as
- 62 requested by the task force.
- (6) Upon presentation of its report, the task force shall be
- 64 dissolved.
