MR. SPEAKER AND MADAM PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H. B. No. 1271: Vulnerable adults; authorize recovery of treble damages in civil action for taking property of.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- 7 SECTION 1. The following shall be codified as Section
- 8 11-7-165, Mississippi Code of 1972:
- 9 11-7-165. (1) In a civil action where it is proven that a
- person took property having a value of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars 10
- 11 (\$250.00) or more belonging to a vulnerable adult by conversion,
- 12 embezzlement, extortion, theft or fraud without the owner's
- consent, or obtained the owner's consent by intimidation, 13
- 14 deception, undue influence or by misusing a position of trust or a
- 15 confidential relationship with the owner, then whether the action
- 16 is to recover the property or damages in lieu thereof, or both,
- 17 damages shall be recoverable up to three (3) times the amount of
- 18 the monetary damages or value of the property embezzled, converted
- or otherwise stolen, in addition to any other damages. 19
- 20 (2) For purposes of this section, "position of trust" shall
- 2.1 include, but not be limited to, a person who:
- 22 (a) Is named the attorney-in-fact in a power of
- attorney, whether executed before or after the adult became 23
- 24 vulnerable;
- 25 Has assumed a duty to provide care to the
- vulnerable adult; 26

- 27 (c) Is in a fiduciary relationship with the vulnerable
- 28 adult, including a de facto guardian or de facto conservator; or
- 29 (d) Is a joint tenant or tenant in common with the
- 30 vulnerable adult.
- 31 "Vulnerable adult" shall have the meaning defined in
- 32 Section 43-47-5, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- (4) Civil remedies provided under this section shall be 33
- supplemental and cumulative, and not exclusive of other remedies 34
- afforded under any other law. Damages awarded under this section 35
- 36 are remedial and not punitive, and do not limit and are not
- 37 limited by any criminal action or any other provision of law.
- civil damages paid by the civil defendant shall reduce the amount 38
- such defendant, upon conviction, may be ordered to pay in 39
- restitution, and any restitution paid under a criminal penalty 40
- shall reduce any civil damages owed. 41
- 42 (5) The cause of action, the right to bring a cause of
- 43 action, or the right to seek treble damages pursuant to this
- section shall not be limited or affected by the death of the 44
- 45 owner.
- 46 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 47 and after July 1, 2007.
