REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MR. SPEAKER AND MADAM PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H. B. No. 1691: Appropriation; Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
8	maintenance of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for
9	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008
10	\$ 9,692,469.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of
14	Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks which is comprised of special source
15	funds collected by or otherwise available to the department for
16	the support and maintenance of the department, for the fiscal year
17	beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008

19	The following sum, which is included in the sum appropriated
20	above in this section, is hereby appropriated out of the state
21	excise taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products to

163	SECTION 10. The board of supervisors of any county or any
164	group or combination of counties are hereby authorized and
165	empowered to enter into cooperative agreements with each other and
166	with the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the
167	purpose of creating, improving or restoring parks, public game and
168	fish habitat lying or to be situated wholly or partially within
169	such county or in an adjoining county; and each county is
170	empowered and authorized, in its discretion, to expend a sum not
171	exceeding One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) from the
172	general county fund for such purposes from which fund they shall
173	reimburse to the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks the
174	actual cost of all surveying and engineering projects incurred by
175	the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks incidental
176	thereto. Such boards of supervisors are further authorized and
177	empowered, in their discretion, to enter into agreements necessary
178	to carry out the purposes of this act with any other county, the
179	United States Forest Service or any other agency if same should be
180	necessary for the acquisition of land by lease or otherwise for
181	such purposes.
182	SECTION 11. It shall be unlawful for any officer, employee
183	or other person whatsoever to use or permit or authorize the use
184	of any automobile or any other motor vehicle owned by the State of

- Mississippi or any department, agency or institution thereof for 185 186 any purpose other than upon the official business of the State of Mississippi or any agency, department or institution thereof. 187 188 It is the intent of the Legislature that motor vehicles 189 authorized to be owned and operated by this agency shall comply 190 with Sections 25-1-77 through 25-1-93, Mississippi Code of 1972. 191 SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the 192 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from any source, not 193 194 to exceed One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), that may become 195 available to the department in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration. 196 197 SECTION 13. In order to be in compliance with Sections 63-1-74 through 63-1-79, funds are herein provided and may be 198 expended by the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks to pay 199 200 the costs of commercial driver's licenses for specific employees 201 and/or to reimburse such costs for specific employees who, in the course of their duties and responsibilities, are required to hold 202 203 a valid Mississippi Commercial Driver's License. 204 SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the 205 206 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Mississippi 207 Development Authority in the amount of Four Million Dollars 208 (\$4,000,000.00) as authorized in Section 57-61-32 (1), Mississippi 209 Code of 1972. Such funds are to be used to defray the cost of 210 constructing a North Mississippi Fish Hatchery.
- SECTION 15. The Mississippi Department of Wildlife,
 Fisheries and Parks is authorized to provide financial support of
 One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) and to enter into
 an agreement with the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service
 for a biology specialist and related supportive cost.

- 219 **SECTION 16.** The department is authorized to spend up to
- 220 twenty-five percent (25%) of revenue in the State Park Timber

- 223 **SECTION 17.** As funds become available to the department, an
- 224 amount equal to One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 225 (\$1,500,000.00) may be used for completion of the North
- 226 Mississippi Fish Hatchery and any repair of levies or dams as
- 227 deemed necessary by the department.
- 228 **SECTION 18.** It is the intention of the Legislature that no
- 229 more than Nine Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$950,000.00) be
- 230 spent from the Motor Vehicle Fund for the purchase of motor
- 231 vehicles.
- 232 **SECTION 19.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 233 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 234 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 235 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 236 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 237 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 238 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 239 made without competitive bids.
- 240 **SECTION 20.** With the funds appropriated herein, it is the
- 241 intention of the Legislature that a reasonable number of
- 242 Conservation Officers, Conservation Officer Supervisors, District
- 243 Managers, Area Managers, and Lake Managers shall be employed
- 244 and/or detailed to both temporary and permanent job assignments in
- 245 areas other than their county of residence.
- 246 **SECTION 21.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 247 Commission of the Mississippi Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall

264	Development Authority, Division of Tourism, for the purpose of
265	advertising and promoting the state parks.
266	SECTION 24. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
267	Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the
268	authority to accept, budget and expend any source funds not to
269	exceed One Million Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
270	(\$1,350,000.00) for a goat and swine processing plant at Alcorn
271	State University. Such funds are to be escalated in accordance
272	with procedures for federal fund escalations as established in
273	Section 27-104-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, and expended for the
274	purposes of performing such duties as set forth by law in
275	accordance with applicable rules and regulations of the State
276	Fiscal Officer.
277	SECTION 25. In expending the funds appropriated by this act
278	the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall be subject
279	to the following conditions:

280	(a) The department may lease state park lands within
281	Hugh White State Park and John Kyle State Park and authorize the
282	lessee to construct, maintain and operate overnight accommodation
283	facilities and recreational facilities;

- 284 Any such lease under paragraph (a) must be approved 285 by the commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks. Before 286 approving Hugh White State Park or John Kyle State Park lands for 287 lease and development, the commission must make an affirmative 288 finding and enter upon its official minutes a statement that the 289 development of that land will not be incompatible with the outdoor 290 recreational purposes and opportunities existing at Hugh White State Park and John Kyle State Park. 291
- 292 (c) Facilities to be developed on leased park lands 293 shall be open and available for use by the general public and of 294 such a nature as to promote outdoor recreation or complement the 295 recreational opportunities available at the park.
 - SECTION 26. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
- 302 SECTION 27. This act shall take effect and be in force from 303 and after July 1, 2007.
