## REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

## MR. SPEAKER AND MADAM PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H. B. No. 1696: Appropriation; State Department of Health-support.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
8	defraying the expenses of the State Department of Health for the
9	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008
10	\$ 36,903,314.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Department
14	of Health which is comprised of special source funds collected by
15	or otherwise available to the department, for the purpose of
16	defraying the expenses of the department for the fiscal year
17	beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008
18	\$ 263,756,583.00.
19	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
20	Sections 1 and 2, Five Million Four Hundred Four Thousand Two
21	Hundred Seventy Dollars (\$5,404,270.00) shall be derived from the
22	State General Fund and Seven Million One Hundred Fifty-eight
23	Thousand Three Hundred Thirty-seven Dollars (\$7,158,337.00) shall
24	be derived from the Health Care Expendable Fund, created in
25	Section 43-13-407, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the support and

26	maintenance of the State Department of Health. The funds provided
27	in this section shall be allocated as follows:

37	development and implementation of an enhanced reimbursement fee
38	program related to trauma care and services, used to match federal
39	funds, under a cooperative agreement between the State Department
40	of Health and the Division of Medicaid.
41	It is the intention of the Legislature that none of the Five
42	Million Three Hundred Twenty-six Thousand Nine Hundred One Dollars
43	(\$5,326,901.00) authorized herein for the Trauma Care System shall
44	be expended to the benefit of any hospital located outside the
45	boundaries of the State of Mississippi, unless otherwise excepted
46	in this paragraph. Further, unless otherwise excepted in this
47	paragraph, no such out-of-state hospital shall be authorized to
48	receive such funds until such time as the amount appropriated for
49	such purpose shall reach an amount of Eight Million Dollars
50	(\$8,000,000.00) or more. Funds shall be expended by the
51	Mississippi Department of Health for distribution to the Regional
52	Medical Center at Memphis, located in Memphis, Tennessee, for
53	their participation in the Trauma Care System.
54	SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Twenty
55	Million Dollars (\$20,000,000.00) shall be derived from the Tobacco
56	Control Program Fund, created in Senate Bill 2764, 2007 Regular
57	Session, and shall be allocated as follows:

76	Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amounts set forth below shall
77	be expended for the respective major objects or purposes of

101	Funds are provided herein to adjust the Variable Compensation
102	Plan to ensure that all full-time employees receive a pay increase
103	equal to the realignment component of the Variable Compensation
104	Plan or One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00), whichever
105	is greater, to be awarded on July 1, 2007.
106	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
107	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
108	make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
109	Services" for Fiscal Year 2009 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2008
110	funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions
111	are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2008 budget by the
112	Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the
113	Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall
114	determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all
115	appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this
116	act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure
117	that no single personnel action increases this projected annual
118	cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2008 appropriations for "Personal
119	Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds
120	and educational benchmarks. If, at the time the agency takes any
121	action to change "Personal Services", the State Personnel Board

determines that the agency has taken an action which would cause 122 123 the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2008 "Personal Services" appropriated level, when annualized, then 124 125 only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or 126 the appropriation requirement will be processed by the State 127 Personnel Board until such time as the requirements of this 128 provision are met. On January 1, 2008, the State Personnel Board 129 will make adjustments to the structure side of the compliance report based on data provided by the Legislative Budget Office in 130 131 order for agencies to award educational benchmarks. 132 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 133 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 134 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 135 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. 136 137 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 138 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 139 140 appropriated level. 141 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 142 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 143 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 144 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available. 145 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 146 State Department of Health shall maintain complete accounting and 147 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 148 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 149 2007. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the 150 151 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2009 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 152

155	SECTION 7. In compliance with the "Mississipp	i Performance
156	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is t	he intent of

159	intended mission of this agency. Based on the fund	ing authorized,

202	not to exceed Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00), to the ager	гсу
203	for expenditure. Upon such approval, the Mississippi Departmen	nt
204	of Health may expend such funds in the manner authorized by law	<i>J</i> .
205	The Executive Director of the Mississippi Department of	
206	Health shall submit to the Department of Finance and	
207	Administration a certified statement providing a detailed	
208	explanation for any escalation, including a justification for	he
209	establishment of any new positions or reclassification of exist	ing
210	positions and the existence of any required matching funds for	
211	those positions, and an assessment of the impact on the agency	s
212	General Fund Budget for the three (3) fiscal years following the	ne
213	fiscal year in which the escalation is requested.	
214	SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that w	th
215	the funds provided herein, the State Department of Health may	
216	provide and administer without charge, Hepatitis B vaccinations	s to

217	Emergency Medical Services (EMS) personnel who are in need of such
218	vaccinations through job related exposure.
219	SECTION 10. In addition to all other sums heretofore
220	appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be
221	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
222	Treasury to the credit of the Local Governments and Rural Water
223	Systems Emergency Loan Fund, and the Local Governments and Rural
224	Water System Improvements Revolving Loan Fund as authorized in
225	Chapter 521, Laws of 1995, to the State Department of Health for
226	the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Local Governments and
227	Rural Water Systems Improvements Board, for the fiscal year
228	beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008
229	\$ 28,000,000.00.
230	SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, One
231	Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) shall come from the Department of
232	Human Services, Child Care Development Fund or other appropriate
233	special funds for the purpose of child care licensure. These
234	funds are to be transferred to the State Department of Health no
235	later than July 31, 2007. The State Department of Health shall
236	make a complete accounting of the uses of these funds to the
237	Department of Human Services.
238	SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
239	State Department of Health shall expend not more than Fifty
240	Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) of the funds appropriated in Section
241	1 and allocated in Section 5 for providing the oil known as
242	"Lorenzo's Oil" for the treatment of the genetic disorder
243	adrenoleukodystrophy (ALD), to children and Mississippi residents
244	over the age of twenty-one (21) who have the genetic disorder
245	adrenoleukodystrophy and for whom Medicaid does not reimburse the
246	cost of providing the oil. The department may also provide needed
247	pathology and biannual MRI exams.

248	SECTION 13. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Seven
249	Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$700,000.00) are provided for the
250	purpose of purchasing AIDS drugs and other necessary AIDS related
251	medical services.
252	SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, One
253	Million Nine Hundred Sixty Thousand Eight Hundred Eighty-one
254	Dollars (\$1,960,881.00) is provided for the Ryan White Care Grant
255	program.
256	SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1,
257	Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) shall be provided to the
258	Southern AIDS Commission, Inc., for the purpose of providing
259	technical assistance, and providing for the expansion of education
260	on causes and prevention of HIV/AIDS, and providing delivery
261	services to persons infected with HIV. The Southern AIDS
262	Commission, Inc. shall report by February 1, 2008, to the Board of
263	Health and the Chairmen of the House and Senate Public Health
264	Committees the status of the project and all services provided.
265	SECTION 16. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1,
266	Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) shall be provided to the
267	Tupelo Regional AIDS Inter-Faith Network, Inc., for the purpose of
268	providing technical assistance, providing for the expansion of
269	education on causes and prevention of HIV/AIDS, and providing
270	delivery services to persons infected with HIV. The Southern AIDS
271	Commission, Inc. shall report by February 1, 2008, to the Board of
272	Health and the Chairmen of the House and Senate Public Health
273	Committees the status of the project and all services provided.
274	SECTION 17. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2,
275	and allocated in Section 3, the amounts of One Hundred Ten
276	Thousand Nine Hundred Seventy-seven Dollars (\$110,977.00) shall be
277	allocated to the T.K. Martin Center at Mississippi State
278	University and One Hundred Ten Thousand Nine Hundred Seventy-seven
279	Dollars (\$110,977.00) shall be allocated to the Regional

281	Program.
282	SECTION 18. Of the funds appropriated herein, One Hundred
283	Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) is provided for the Breast
284	and Cervical Cancer Program.
285	SECTION 19. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Seven
286	Hundred Fifteen Thousand Four Hundred Seventy-five Dollars
287	(\$715,475.00) is provided for the Tuberculosis Program and Eight
288	Hundred Five Thousand One Hundred Twenty-three Dollars
289	(\$805,123.00) is provided for the Epidemiology program.
290	SECTION 20. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
291	Executive Director of the State Department of Health may authorize
292	increases in major objects of expenditure in total amounts not to
293	exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the appropriated amount of
294	each major object of expenditure, provided that other major
295	objects of expenditure are decreased by a corresponding dollar
296	amount. However, no transfers shall be authorized which increase
297	the major object of expenditure "Salaries, Wages and Fringe
298	Benefits."
299	SECTION 21. In addition to all other funds heretofore
300	appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be
301	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
302	Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Burn Care Fund which is
303	comprised of special source funds collected by or otherwise
304	available to the department, for the purpose of funding the
305	development of a plan for delivery of services and of providing
306	reimbursement for uncompensated medical care to Mississippi burn
307	victims through the trauma care system, for the fiscal year
308	beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008
309	\$3,000,000.00.
310	The State Department of Health shall issue any certificates
311	of need necessary to any person proposing the construction of,

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addition of, or conversion of any beds or the expansion of any 312 313 health care facility for use exclusively for the treatment of burn 314 victims, and such beds shall be classified and limited to use for 315 such treatment of burn victims and may not be converted to any 316 other use and are not to be classified or included in the acute 317 care bed inventory of the state for health planning purposes. Any 318 such beds shall participate in the statewide trauma care system as provided by Section 41-59-5 and be entitled to an allocation of 319 320 funds from the Mississippi Burn Care Fund as established by 321 Section 7-9-70. For purposes of this subsection, the provisions 322 of Section 41-7-193(1) requiring substantial compliance with the 323 projection of need as reported in the current State Health Plan 324 are waived. SECTION 22. It is the intention of the Legislature that 325 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 326 327 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 328 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 329 330 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 331 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 332 made without competitive bids. 333 SECTION 23. Of the funds appropriated herein, the State 334 Department of Health shall review the State Health Plan using 335 current technology and data and make a report with their 336 recommendations to the Legislature by December 15, 2007. This report shall be provided to the Speaker of the House and the 337 Lieutenant Governor; the Chairmen of the Senate and House 338 Appropriations Committees; and the Chairmen of the Senate Public 339 Health and Welfare Committee and the House Public Health and Human 340 341 Services Committee. SECTION 24. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 342

the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the

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credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 344 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 345 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 346 347 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 348 SECTION 25. This act shall take effect and be in force from 349 and after July 1, 2007.

## Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
