We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

Based on data provided by the 194 195 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 196 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 197 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 198 199 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2008 appropriations for "Personal 200 201 Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds 202 and educational benchmarks. If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal Services", the State Personnel Board 203 204 determines that the agency has taken an action which would cause 205 the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 206 2008 "Personal Services" appropriated level, when annualized, then 207 only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or 208 the appropriation requirement will be processed by the State 209 Personnel Board until such time as the requirements of this 210 provision are met. On January 1, 2008, the State Personnel Board will make adjustments to the structure side of the compliance 211 212 report based on data provided by the Legislative Budget Office in 213 order for agencies to award educational benchmarks. Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 214 215 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 216 217 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written

218	approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The	ne

SECTION 7. No part of the funds herein appropriated shall be 281 282 used for the purpose of returning escaped state convicts to the 283 State Penitentiary from a distance of over one hundred (100) miles 284 beyond the borders of the state, except upon approval of the 285 Governor in each specific case. 286 SECTION 8. None of the money herein appropriated shall be 287 paid to any person who by the provision of Section 47-5-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, is prohibited from being an 288 289 employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections. The State 290 Department of Finance and Administration shall at least annually 291 make a report to the Joint Legislative Committee on Performance 292 Evaluation and Expenditure Review and to the Attorney General 293 stating the name of any person prohibited under the provisions of 294 Section 47-5-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, from being 295 an employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections who has 296 during the preceding year received any money herein appropriated. 297 In the event that any such person prohibited as herein above 298 provided from receiving funds herein appropriated should receive 299 any of said funds, the Attorney General shall immediately commence 300 action to recover the monies so paid to said person and to enjoin 301 the further employment of said person at the Mississippi 302 Department of Corrections. 303 SECTION 9. It is the intent of the Legislature that all 304 prisoners at Parchman shall work a minimum of eight (8) hours per 305 day, excluding prisoners with a physical disability or those 306 incarcerated in maximum security. 307 SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 308 Department of Corrections shall have the authority to accept, budget and expend any special funds collected or otherwise 309 310 available, through the sell of scrap or recycled material, for the

purpose of providing recycling equipment, supplies or services for

use within the department.

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313	SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
314	per diem rates paid to regional facilities shall not exceed
315	Twenty-nine Dollars and Seventy-four Cents (\$29.74) per inmate.
316	All regional facilities shall continue to receive the annual three
317	percent (3%) increase in the per diem rate as authorized in
318	Section 47-5-933, Mississippi Code of 1972, however, in no event
319	shall any regional facility's per diem rate exceed Twenty-nine
320	Dollars and Seventy-four Cents (\$29.74) per inmate.
321	SECTION 12. The department or its contracted medical
322	provider will pay to a provider of a medical service for any and
323	all incarcerated persons from a correctional or detention facility
324	an amount based upon negotiated fees as agreed to by the medical
325	care service providers and the department and/or its contracted
326	medical provider. In the absence of negotiated discounted fee
327	schedule, medical care service providers will be paid by the
328	department or its contracted medical service provider an amount no
329	greater than the reimbursement rate applicable based on the
330	Mississippi Medicaid reimbursement rate. This limitation applies
331	to all medical care services, durable and nondurable goods,
332	prescription drugs and medications provided to any and all
333	incarcerated persons outside of the correctional or detention
334	facility.
335	SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
336	Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of Corrections shall
337	have the authority to transfer cash from one special fund treasury
338	fund to another special fund treasury fund under the control of
339	the Department of Corrections. The purpose of this authority is
340	to more efficiently use available cash reserves. It is further
341	the intention of the Legislature that the Department of
342	Corrections shall submit written justification for the transfer to
343	the Legislative Budget Office and the Department of Finance and

- 344 Administration on or before the fifteenth (15th) of the month 345 prior to the effective date of the transfer.
- 346 **SECTION 14.** The Commissioner of the Mississippi Department
- 347 of Corrections is hereby authorized to transfer spending authority
- 348 between and within budgets, both positions and funds, in an amount
- 349 not to exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the authorized budgets
- 350 in the aggregate. It is further the intention of the Legislature
- 351 that the Department of Corrections shall submit written
- 352 justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office
- 353 and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the
- 354 fifteenth (15th) of the month prior to the effective date of the
- 355 transfer. However, no transfers shall be authorized which
- 356 increase the major object of expenditure "Salaries, Wages and
- 357 Fringe Benefits" in any budget authorized in Section 3 of this
- 358 act.
- 359 **SECTION 15.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 360 Mississippi Department of Corrections shall have the authority to
- 361 receive, budget, and expend funds from any source, including
- 362 beginning cash in excess of beginning cash when spending authority
- 363 was initially appropriated, that may become available to the
- 364 department in accordance with the rules and regulations of the
- 365 Department of Finance and Administration in a matter consistent
- 366 with the escalation of federal funds.
- 367 **SECTION 16.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 368 Department of Corrections shall have the authority to accept,
- 369 budget and expend any portion of confiscated funds received in
- 370 conjunction with its participating in investigations of illegal
- 371 activities of any offender under the supervision of the agency.
- 372 These funds shall be used to provide security enhancement within
- 373 the Department of Corrections.
- 374 **SECTION 17.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
- 375 of Section 2, Forty-four Million Three Hundred Four Thousand Two

376	Hundred Twenty-two Dollars (\$44,304,222.00) shall be derived from
377	the Budget Contingency Fund created in Section 27-103-301,
378	Mississippi Code of 1972, for the support and maintenance of the
379	Mississippi Department of Corrections. The funds provided in this
380	section shall be allocated as follows:
381	Private Prisons\$ 22,021,755.00
382	Medical Services\$ 11,750,703.00
383	Regional Facilities\$ 8,193,764.00
384	Local Confinement\$ 2,338,000.00
385	SECTION 18. Of the funds provided herein, the Commissioner
386	of the Mississippi Department of Corrections is hereby authorized
387	to transfer any source funds to the "Regional Facilities" budget
388	within the Department of Corrections in order to contract with
389	Yazoo County, Chickasaw County, Washington County, Hinds County,
390	and Alcorn County if it is determined that any one of these
391	county regional facilities identified in House Bill 985, 2007
392	Regular Session, becomes operational during Fiscal Year 2008.
393	SECTION 19. It is the intention of the Legislature that
394	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
395	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
396	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
397	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
398	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
399	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
400	made without competitive bids.
401	SECTION 20. It is legislative intent to ensure beneficial
402	information reaches as many Mississippians as possible. Further,
403	it is legislative intent that the expenditure of public funds for
404	this purpose be accomplished in an efficient and effective manner.
405	Therefore, state agencies as standard procedure, will observe

- 411 (c) Seek public service announcements, which would be 412 aired by media without cost.
- Itemize and justify professional assistance and 413 414 related expenses for creative and production costs outside of the 415 actual media expenditures.
- 416 (e) Utilize Mississippi owned media companies when 417 feasible.
- 418 SECTION 21. The department is authorized to expend available 419 funds on technology or equipment upgrades or replacements when it 420 will generate savings through efficiency or when the savings 421 generated from such upgrades or replacements exceed expenditures 422 thereof.
 - SECTION 22. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
- 429 SECTION 23. This act shall take effect and be in force from 430 and after July 1, 2007.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
