House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 2057

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

Section 63-3-809, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 9 amended as follows: 63-3-809. (1) Upon the immediate approach of an authorized 10 emergency vehicle, when the driver is giving audible signal by 11 siren, exhaust whistle, or bell, the driver of every other vehicle 12 shall yield the right-of-way and shall immediately drive to a 13 14 position parallel to, and as close as possible to, the right-hand 15 edge or curb of the roadway clear of any intersection and shall stop and remain in such position until the authorized emergency 16 17 vehicle has passed, except when otherwise directed by a law 18 enforcement officer. 19 Upon approaching a stationary authorized emergency vehicle, when such vehicle is giving a signal by use of flashing, 20 blinking, oscillating or rotating lights, as authorized under 21 Section 63-7-19, a person who drives an approaching vehicle shall: 2.2 (a) Proceeding with due caution, yield the right-of-way 23 24 by making a lane change into a lane not adjacent to that of the authorized emergency vehicle, if possible with due regard to 25 safety and traffic conditions, if on a roadway having at least 26 27 four (4) lanes with not less than two (2) lanes proceeding in the 28 same direction as the approaching vehicle; or 29 (b) Proceeding with due caution, reduce the speed of the vehicle, maintaining a safe speed for road conditions and 30 being prepared to stop, if changing lanes would be impossible or 31

unsafe.

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         (3) Upon approaching a stationary recovery vehicle or a
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    highway maintenance vehicle, when such vehicle is giving a signal
    by use of authorized flashing lights, a person who drives an
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    approaching vehicle shall:
              (a) Proceeding with due caution, yield the right-of-way
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    by making a lane change into a lane not adjacent to the stationary
    recovery vehicle or the highway maintenance vehicle, if possible
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    with due regard to safety and traffic conditions, if on a roadway
    having at least four (4) lanes with not less than two (2) lanes
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    proceeding in the same direction as the approaching vehicle; or
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              (b) Proceeding with due caution, reduce the speed of
    the vehicle, maintaining a safe speed for road conditions and
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    being prepared to stop, if changing lanes would be impossible or
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    unsafe.
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         (4) For purposes of this section, unless the context
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    otherwise clearly requires:
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              (a) "Highway maintenance vehicle" means a vehicle used
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    for the maintenance of highways and roadways in this state and is:
                   (i) Owned or operated by the Department of
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    Transportation, a county, a municipality or other political
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    subdivision of this state; or
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                   (ii) Owned or operated by a contractor under
    contract with the Department of Transportation, a county, a
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    municipality or other political subdivision of this state;
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              (b) "Recovery vehicle" means a truck that is
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    specifically designed for towing a disabled vehicle or a
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    combination of vehicles.
         (5) A violation of this section is a misdemeanor punishable
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    by a fine:
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              (a) Of not more than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars
    ($250.00); or
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              (b) Of not more than One Thousand Dollars ($1,000.00)
    if violation of this section results in:
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                   (i) Property damage to the emergency vehicle,
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highway maintenance vehicle or recovery vehicle; or

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- (ii) Bodily injury to the driver or a passenger of
- 69 any such vehicle.

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- 70 (2) This section shall not operate to relieve the driver of
- 71 an authorized emergency vehicle, a recovery vehicle or a highway
- 72 <u>maintenance vehicle</u> from the duty to drive with due regard for the
- 73 safety of all persons using the roadway.
- 74 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 75 and after July 1, 2007.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-3-809, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE MOTOR VEHICLE OPERATORS TO PERFORM CERTAIN TRAFFIC SAFETY MANEUVERS WHEN APPROACHING A STATIONARY AUTHORIZED EMERGENCY VEHICLE, A RECOVERY VEHICLE OR A HIGHWAY MAINTENANCE VEHICLE; TO PRESCRIBE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THIS ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
