House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 2152

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

Section 11-27-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 7 amended as follows: 11-27-1. 8 (1) Any person or corporation having the right to 9 condemn private property for public use shall exercise that right as provided in this chapter, except as elsewhere specifically 10 provided under the laws of the State of Mississippi. 11 (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of this chapter or any 12 13 other provisions of law to the contrary, the right of eminent domain shall not be exercised for the purposes of converting 14 privately owned real property for retail, office, commercial, 15 16 industrial or residential development; or for enhancement of tax revenue; or for transfer to a person, nongovernmental entity, 17 public-private partnership, corporation or other business entity. 18 19 This subsection shall not apply to drainage and levee facilities and usages, roads and bridges for public conveyance, and common 20 carriers or facilities of public utilities and other entities used 2.1 in the generation, transmission, storage or distribution of 22 23 telephone, telecommunication, gas, carbon dioxide, electricity, 24 water, sewer, natural gas, liquid hydrocarbons or other utility 25 products. 26 (3) Property condemned pursuant to any provision of law, if 27 not used for the purpose or purposes for which it was condemned or 28 for some other public use, after a period of ten (10) years of

- The provisions of this subsection (3) shall apply to any real 41
- property whether condemned before or after the passage of this 42
- act, applicable only to Yellow Creek Port. 43
- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 44
- 45 and after its passage.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 11-27-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROHIBIT USE OF THE POWER OF EMINENT DOMAIN FOR CERTAIN PRIVATE, 2 3 NONGOVERNMENTAL PURPOSES; TO PROVIDE EXEMPTIONS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
