## House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 3015

## TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

## **AMENDMENT NO. 1**

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

7	SECTION 1. Section 37-105-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
8	amended as follows:
9	37-105-3. (1) The traffic officers duly appointed by the
LO	president of any state institution of higher learning, or any
L1	peace officer or highway patrolman of this state, are vested with
L2	the powers and authority to perform all duties incident to
L3	enforcing such rules and regulations as may be enacted under the
L4	authority granted in Section 37-105-1, including the arrest of
L5	violators.
L6	(2) The peace officers duly employed by Jackson State
L7	University and the University of Southern Mississippi are also
L8	vested with the powers and subjected to the duties of a constable
L9	for the purpose of preventing all violations of law that occur
20	within five hundred (500) feet of any property owned by the
21	university, if such universities determine that they want such
22	peace officers to exercise such powers and if reasonably
23	determined to have a possible impact on the safety of students,
24	faculty or staff of the university while on said property.
25	Provided, however, that nothing in this section shall be
26	interpreted to require action by any such peace officer appointed
27	by such universities to events occurring outside the boundaries of
28	university property, nor shall any such university or its
29	employees be liable for any failure to act to any event occurring
30	outside the boundaries of property owned by the university.

Jackson State University and the University of Southern

Mississippi may enter into an interlocal agreement with other law

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enforcement entities for the provision of equipment or traffic
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- 34 control duties, however, the duty to enforce traffic regulations
- and to enforce the laws of the state or municipality off of 35
- university property lies with the local police or sheriff's 36
- 37 department which cannot withhold its services solely because of
- 38 the lack of such an agreement.
- SECTION 2. Section 37-29-275, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 39
- 40 amended as follows:
- 37-29-275. Any act, which, if committed within the limits of 41
- a city, town or village, or in any public place, would be a 42
- violation of the general laws of this state, shall be criminal and 43
- punishable if done on the campus, grounds or roads of any of the 44
- state-supported junior colleges. The peace officers duly 45
- appointed by the board of trustees of state-supported community or 46
- 47 junior colleges or officers of private security firms licensed by
- the State of Mississippi contracted by the boards of trustees of 48
- 49 state supported community/junior colleges are vested with the
- powers and subjected to the duties of a constable for the purpose 50
- of preventing and punishing all violations of law on 51
- state-supported junior college grounds and for preserving order 52
- 53 and decorum thereon. Peace officers appointed by the boards of
- 54 trustees or officers of private security firms licensed by the
- State of Mississippi contracted by the boards of trustees shall 55
- have authority to bear arms in order to carry out their law 56
- enforcement responsibilities if such officers have been certified 57
- 58 according to the minimum standards established by the Board on Law
- Enforcement Officer Standards and Training. 59 The peace officers
- 60 duly appointed by the boards of trustees of public
- community/junior colleges are also vested with the powers and 61
- subjected to the duties of a constable for the purpose of 62
- 63 preventing all violations of law that occur within five hundred
- (500) feet of any property owned by the college, if reasonably 64
- determined to have a possible impact on the safety of students, 65
- 66 faculty or staff of the college while on said property. Provided,
- 67 however, that nothing in this section shall be interpreted to

- 68 require action by any such peace officer appointed by a college to
- 69 events occurring outside the boundaries of college property, nor
- 70 shall any such college or its employees be liable for any failure
- 71 to act to any event occurring outside the boundaries of property
- 72 owned by the college. If a law enforcement officer is duly
- 73 appointed to be a peace officer by a college under this section,
- 74 the board of trustees of the public community/junior college may
- 75 enter into an interlocal agreement with other law enforcement
- 76 entities for the provision of equipment or traffic control duties,
- 77 however, the duty to enforce traffic regulations and to enforce
- 78 the laws of the state or municipality off of college property lies
- 79 with the local police or sheriff's department which cannot
- 80 withhold its services solely because of the lack of such an
- 81 agreement.

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- 82 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 83 and after July 1, 2007.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 37-105-3 AND 37-29-275, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXPAND THE JURISDICTION OF LAW ENFORCEMENT

OFFICERS EMPLOYED AND DESIGNATED BY CERTAIN STATE UNIVERSITIES OR PUBLIC COMMUNITY/JUNIOR COLLEGE TO INCLUDE THE AREA WITHIN 500

FEET OF UNIVERSITY OR COLLEGE PROPERTY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
