House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 3137

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
8	defraying the expenses of the State Department of Agriculture and

12	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
13	necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special
14	source funds, which are collected by or otherwise become available
15	for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the State Department
16	of Agriculture and Commerce, including the Divisions of Support
17	and Plant Industry and Farmers Central Market, for the fiscal year
18	beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008
19	\$ 5,551,937.00.
20	The funds authorized for expenditure under the provisions of
21	this section include subscription fees produced from the Market
22	Bulletin and admission fees produced from the Mississippi
23	Agriculture and Forestry Museum.
24	SECTION 3. With the funds appropriated under the provisions
25	of Sections 1 and 2, the following positions are authorized:

Funds are provided herein to adjust the Variable Compensation

With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 36 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to 37 38 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2009 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2008 39 40 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2009 budget by the 41 Mississippi Legislature. - 147 provisions of Section 69-51-5, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 148
- 149 State Department of Agriculture and Commerce shall have the
- 150 authority to escalate its budget and expend funds from any source
- 151 not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) in
- 152 accordance with rules and regulations of the Department of Finance
- 153 and Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of

- It is the intention of the Legislature that 155 SECTION 11.
- 156 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 157
- 158 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 159 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 160
- 161 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are

- SECTION 12. It is legislative intent to ensure beneficial 163
- 164 information reaches as many Mississippians as possible. Further,
- 165 it is legislative intent that the expenditure of public funds for
- this purpose be accomplished in an efficient and effective manner. 166
- Therefore, state agencies as standard procedure, will observe 167
- 168 the following criteria:
- 169 (1) Develop goals and desired result for a campaign.

- 170 (2) Evaluate effectiveness through respected advertising 171 standards, including market reach and cost effectiveness.
- 172 (3) Seek public service announcements, which would be aired
 173 by media without cost.
- 174 (4) Itemize and justify professional assistance and related 175 expenses for creative and production costs outside of the actual 176 media expenditures.
- 177 (5) Utilize Mississippi owned media companies when feasible.
- 178 **SECTION 13.** Of the funds provided under the provisions of
- 179 this act, Thirteen Thousand One Hundred Thirty-eight Dollars
- 180 (\$13,138.00) shall be provided to the Fair Commission County
- 181 Livestock Shows for prize money.
- 182 **SECTION 14.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 183 State Department of Agriculture and Commerce shall have the
- 184 authority to accept, budget and expend any source funds not to
- 185 exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) for the Peanut
- 186 Promotion Board. Such funds are to be escalated in accordance
- 187 with procedures for federal fund escalations as established in
- 188 Section 27-104-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, and expended for the
- 189 purposes of performing such duties as set forth by law in
- 190 accordance with applicable rules and regulations of the State
- 191 Fiscal Officer.
- 192 **SECTION 15.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 193 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 194 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 195 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 196 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 197 proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.
- 198 **SECTION 16.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 199 and after July 1, 2007.
