House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 3139

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

S. B. 3139 PAGE 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
8	defraying the expenses of the Mississippi Board of Animal Health
9	for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, and ending
10	June 30, 2008\$ 1,307,947.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special
13	source funds which are collected by or otherwise become available
14	for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Mississippi Board
15	of Animal Health, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, and
16	ending June 30, 2008\$ 636,246.00.
17	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
18	Sections 1 and 2, the following positions are authorized:
19	AUTHORIZED POSITIONS:
20	Permanent: Full Time 22
21	Part Time 0
22	Time-Limited: Full Time 4
23	Part Time 0
24	Funds are provided herein to adjust the Variable Compensation
25	Plan to ensure that all full-time employees receive a pay increase
26	equal to the realignment component of the Variable Compensation
27	Plan or One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00), whichever
28	is greater.
29	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
30	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to

- 31 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
- 32 Services" for Fiscal Year 2009 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2008
- funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 33
- 34 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2009 budget by the
- 35 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the
- Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 36
- determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 37
- 38 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this
- It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 39
- that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 40
- cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2008 appropriation for "Personal 41
- Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 42
- If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 43
- 44 Services, " the State Personnel Board determines that the agency
- 45 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this
- projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2008 "Personal Services" 46
- 47 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
- reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 48
- 49 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
- such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 50
- 51 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 52
- allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 53
- 54 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 55 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration.
- 56 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 57 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 58 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 59 appropriated level.
- 60 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 61 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 62
- act and which are withdrawn and no longer available. 63
- 64 The agency shall not take any action to promote or otherwise
- 65 award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification,

66 realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, or any other

67 means to increase salaries of employees or positions unless

specifically exempted by the following conditions: the award of 68

69 teacher pay increases, the advancement of a trainee/cadet to the

70 next level of a bona fide career ladder, the award of an

educational benchmark for the attainment of Certified Public 71

72 Accountant License or higher level professional certification as

73 determined by the State Personnel Board, the immediate replacement

74 of a departing employee with an individual from within state

service or a new hire at a salary level equivalent to that of the 75

76 departing employee, and the emergency appointment of nurses,

77 pharmacists or other health care professionals at a salary to be

78 determined by the State Personnel Board, unless otherwise

79 authorized in this act.

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80 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the

Executive Director of the Mississippi Board of Animal Health may 81

authorize increases in other objects of expenditure in total

amounts not to exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the 83

84 appropriated amount of each major object of expenditure, provided

that other major objects of expenditure are decreased by a 85

86 corresponding dollar amount. However, no transfers shall be

authorized which increase the major object of expenditure

88 "Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits."

89 SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that

whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 90

purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 91

stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 92

93 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind

shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 94

95 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are

96 made without competitive bids.

SECTION 6. It is legislative intent to ensure beneficial 97

information reaches as many Mississippians as possible. Further, 98

99 it is legislative intent that the expenditure of public funds for

100 this purpose be accomplished in an efficient and effective manner.

- Therefore, state agencies as standard procedure, will observe the following criteria:
- 103 (1) Develop goals and desired result for a campaign.
- 104 (2) Evaluate effectiveness through respected advertising 105 standards, including market reach and cost effectiveness.
- 106 (3) Seek public service announcements, which would be aired 107 by media without cost.
- 108 (4) Itemize and justify professional assistance and related 109 expenses for creative and production costs outside of the actual 110 media expenditures.
- 111 (5) Utilize Mississippi owned media companies when feasible.
- section 7. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
 proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.
- 118 **SECTION 8.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 119 and after July 1, 2007.
