## **AMENDMENT NO. 1**

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

16	Department, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, and ending
17	June 30, 2008\$ 63,158,747.00.
18	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
19	Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amounts set forth below shall
20	be expended for the respective major objects or purposes of

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206 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which

207 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation

requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 208

- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 210
- 211 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 212
- 213 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 214 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 215 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 216 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 217 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 218 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 219
- 220 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 221 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this

- 223 The agency shall not take any action to promote or otherwise
- 224 award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification,
- 225 realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, or any other
- 226 means to increase salaries of employees or positions unless
- 227 specifically exempted by the following conditions: the award of
- 228 teacher pay increases, the advancement of a trainee/cadet to the
- 229 next level of a bona fide career ladder, the award of an
- educational benchmark for the attainment of Certified Public 230
- 231 Accountant License or higher level professional certification as
- 232 determined by the State Personnel Board, the immediate replacement
- 233 of a departing employee with an individual from within state
- service or a new hire at a salary level equivalent to that of the 234
- 235 departing employee, and the emergency appointment of nurses,
- pharmacists or other health care professionals at a salary to be 236
- 237 determined by the State Personnel Board, unless otherwise
- authorized in this act. 238
- 239 SECTION 4. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
- 240 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of

241	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
242	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
243	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
244	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
245	performance measures provided below:

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276 A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets
277 set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the
278 agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget
279 Committee for Fiscal Year 2009.

SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, none shall be expended for personnel housing under the jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections unless the department shall collect a reasonable rent, after a finding of fact as to what is a reasonable rent, and/or the cost of utilities furnished to said housing. The Department of Corrections shall not pay for the installation or monthly service of any telephone installed in a staff residence under its jurisdiction.

SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, and authorized for expenditure in Section 3, payment may be authorized for court ordered attorney fees and any accrued interest subject to the approval of the Office of the Attorney General.

SECTION 7. No part of the funds herein appropriated shall be used for the purpose of returning escaped state convicts to the State Penitentiary from a distance of over one hundred (100) miles beyond the borders of the state, except upon approval of the Governor in each specific case.

employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections. The State
Department of Finance and Administration shall at least annually
make a report to the Joint Legislative Committee on Performance
Evaluation and Expenditure Review and to the Attorney General
stating the name of any person prohibited under the provisions of
Section 47-5-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, from being
an employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections who has
during the preceding year received any money herein appropriated.
In the event that any such person prohibited as herein above

provided from receiving funds herein appropriated should receive

- 312 action to recover the monies so paid to said person and to enjoin

- SECTION 9. It is the intent of the Legislature that all 315
- 316 prisoners at Parchman shall work a minimum of eight (8) hours per
- day, excluding prisoners with a physical disability or those 317
- 318 incarcerated in maximum security.
- 319 SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 320 Department of Corrections shall have the authority to accept,
- 321 budget and expend any special funds collected or otherwise
- 322 available, through the sell of scrap or recycled material, for the
- 323 purpose of providing recycling equipment, supplies or services for
- 324 use within the department.
- 325 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- per diem rates paid to regional facilities shall not exceed 326
- 327 Twenty-nine Dollars and Seventy-four Cents (\$29.74) per inmate.
- 328 All regional facilities shall continue to receive the annual three
- 329 percent (3%) increase in the per diem rate as authorized in
- Section 47-5-933, Mississippi Code of 1972, however, in no event 330
- 331 shall any regional facility's per diem rate exceed Twenty-nine
- 332 Dollars and Seventy-four Cents (\$29.74) per inmate.
- 333 **SECTION 12.** The department or its contracted medical
- provider will pay to a provider of a medical service for any and 334
- 335 all incarcerated persons from a correctional or detention facility
- an amount based upon negotiated fees as agreed to by the medical 336
- 337 care service providers and the department and/or its contracted
- 338 medical provider. In the absence of negotiated discounted fee
- schedule, medical care service providers will be paid by the 339
- 340 department or its contracted medical service provider an amount no
- 341 greater than the reimbursement rate applicable based on the
- 342 Mississippi Medicaid reimbursement rate. This limitation applies
- 343 to all medical care services, durable and nondurable goods,
- 344 prescription drugs and medications provided to any and all

incarcerated persons outside of the correctional or detention facility.

SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of Corrections shall have the authority to transfer cash from one special fund treasury fund to another special fund treasury fund under the control of the Department of Corrections. The purpose of this authority is to more efficiently use available cash reserves. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Corrections shall submit written justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the fifteenth (15th) of the month prior to the effective date of the transfer.

SECTION 14. The Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of Corrections is hereby authorized to transfer spending authority between and within budgets, both positions and funds, in an amount not to exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the authorized budgets in the aggregate. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Corrections shall submit written justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the fifteenth (15th) of the month prior to the effective date of the transfer. However, no transfers shall be authorized which increase the major object of expenditure "Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits" in any budget authorized in Section 3 of this

Mississippi Department of Corrections shall have the authority to receive, budget, and expend funds from any source, including beginning cash in excess of beginning cash when spending authority was initially appropriated, that may become available to the department in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a matter consistent with the escalation of federal funds.

- 416 SECTION 20. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
- 417 of Section 2, Thirty-six Million Four Hundred Sixty-four Thousand
- Two Hundred Twenty-two Dollars (\$36,464,222.00) shall be derived 418
- from the Budget Contingency Fund, as created in Section 419
- 420 27-103-301, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 421 SECTION 21. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
- 422 of Section 2, Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00) shall be
- derived from the Working Cash-Stabilization Reserve Fund. 423
- 424 SECTION 22. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 425 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 426
- warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 427
- 428 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 429
- 430 SECTION 23. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 431 and after July 1, 2007.
