Adopted COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

8 SECTION 1. Section 63-3-809, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
9 amended as follows:

10 63-3-809. (1) Upon the immediate approach of an authorized 11 emergency vehicle, when the driver is giving audible signal by 12 siren, exhaust whistle, or bell, the driver of every other vehicle shall yield the right-of-way and shall immediately drive to a 13 position parallel to, and as close as possible to, the right-hand 14 edge or curb of the roadway clear of any intersection and shall 15 16 stop and remain in such position until the authorized emergency 17 vehicle has passed, except when otherwise directed by a law 18 enforcement officer.

19 Upon approaching a stationary authorized emergency (2) vehicle, when such vehicle is giving a signal by use of flashing, 20 21 blinking, oscillating or rotating lights, as authorized under 22 Section 63-7-19, a person who drives an approaching vehicle shall: (a) Proceeding with due caution, yield the right-of-way 23 by making a lane change into a lane not adjacent to that of the 24 authorized emergency vehicle, if possible with due regard to 25 26 safety and traffic conditions, if on a roadway having at least

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four (4) lanes with not less than two (2) lanes proceeding in the 27 28 same direction as the approaching vehicle; or 29 (b) Proceeding with due caution, reduce the speed of 30 the vehicle, maintaining a safe speed for road conditions and 31 being prepared to stop, if changing lanes would be impossible or 32 unsafe. 33 (3) Upon approaching a stationary recovery vehicle or a highway maintenance vehicle, when such vehicle is giving a signal 34 35 by use of authorized flashing lights, a person who drives an 36 approaching vehicle shall: 37 (a) Proceeding with due caution, yield the right-of-way 38 by making a lane change into a lane not adjacent to the stationary recovery vehicle or the highway maintenance vehicle, if possible 39 40 with due regard to safety and traffic conditions, if on a roadway having at least four (4) lanes with not less than two (2) lanes 41 42 proceeding in the same direction as the approaching vehicle; or 43 (b) Proceeding with due caution, reduce the speed of 44 the vehicle, maintaining a safe speed for road conditions and 45 being prepared to stop, if changing lanes would be impossible or 46 unsafe. 47 (4) For purposes of this section, unless the context 48 otherwise clearly requires: 49 (a) "Highway maintenance vehicle" means a vehicle used 50 for the maintenance of highways and roadways in this state and is: 51 (i) Owned or operated by the Department of Transportation, a county, a municipality or other political 52 53 subdivision of this state; or 54 (ii) Owned or operated by a contractor under contract with the Department of Transportation, a county, a 55 56 municipality or other political subdivision of this state;

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57	(b) "Recovery vehicle" means a truck that is
58	specifically designed for towing a disabled vehicle or a
59	combination of vehicles.
60	(5) A violation of this section is a misdemeanor punishable
61	by a fine:
62	(a) Of not more than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars
63	(\$250.00); or
64	(b) Of not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00)
65	if violation of this section results in:
66	(i) Property damage to the emergency vehicle,
67	highway maintenance vehicle or recovery vehicle; or
68	(ii) Bodily injury to the driver or a passenger of
69	any such vehicle.
70	(2) This section shall not operate to relieve the driver of
71	an authorized emergency vehicle, a recovery vehicle or a highway
72	maintenance vehicle from the duty to drive with due regard for the
73	safety of all persons using the roadway.
74	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
75	and after July 1, 2007.
