## Adopted COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO

## Senate Bill No. 2671

## **BY: Committee**

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- 7 **SECTION 1.** Section 73-15-27, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 8 amended as follows:
- 9 73-15-27. The license of every person licensed under the
- 10 provisions of this chapter shall be renewed biennially except as
- 11 hereinafter provided:
- 12 (a) Registered nurses:
- 13 (i) The license to practice as a registered nurse
- 14 shall be valid for two (2) calendar years, beginning January 1 of
- 15 each uneven-numbered year and expiring December 31 in each
- 16 even-numbered year of the biennial period and subject to renewal
- 17 for each period of two (2) years thereafter.
- 18 (ii) A notice for renewal of licensure will be
- 19 mailed by the board on or before November 1 of the year the
- 20 license expires to every person to whom a license was issued or
- 21 renewed during the biennial period. An application shall be
- 22 completed and returned to the board by December 31 of that year
- 23 with the biennial renewal fee to be set at the discretion of the
- 24 board, but not to exceed Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00).

(iii) Upon receipt of the application and fee, the 25 26 board shall verify the accuracy of the application and issue to 27 the applicant a certificate of renewal for the ensuing period of two (2) years. Such renewal shall render the holder thereof the 28 29 right to practice as a registered nurse. 30 (iv) A registered nurse may request in writing to 31 the board that his or her license be placed on inactive status. 32 The board may grant such request and shall have authority, in its discretion, to attach conditions to the licensure of such 33 34 registered nurse while on inactive status. A biennial renewal fee for inactive registered nurses shall be set at the discretion of 35 the board, not to exceed Fifty Dollars (\$50.00). 36 37 (v) Any registered nurse applying for a license, renewal of an active license, reinstatement of a lapsed license, 38 or change from inactive to active status may be required to 39 40 provide evidence of continuing basic nursing competencies when 41 such nurse has not practiced nursing for compensation or performed 42 the function of a registered nurse in a voluntary capacity with or 43 without compensation within the five-year period immediately prior 44 to such application for a license, renewal, reinstatement or 45 change of status. 46 (vi) Any registered nurse who permits his or her 47 license to lapse by failing to renew the license as provided above may be reinstated by the board on satisfactory explanation for 48 49 such failure to renew his or her license, by compliance with all other applicable provisions of this chapter, by completion of a 50 51 reinstatement form, and upon payment of a reinstatement fee not to exceed Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00), which shall not 52 53 include the renewal fee for the current biennial period. 54 registered nurse who permits his or her license to lapse shall be

notified by the board within fifteen (15) days of such lapse.

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- 56 (vii) Any person practicing as a registered nurse 57 during the time his or her license has lapsed shall be considered 58 in violation of this chapter and shall be subject to the penalties 59 provided for violation of this chapter, provided the registered 60 nurse has not submitted the required reinstatement form and fees within fifteen (15) days after notification by the board of such 61 62 lapse. (b) Licensed practical nurses: 63
- (i) The license to practice as a licensed

  practical nurse shall be valid for two (2) calendar years,

  beginning January 1 of each even-numbered year and expiring

  December 31 in each uneven-numbered year of the biennial period

  and subject to renewal for each period of two (2) years
- (ii) A notice for renewal of licensure will be
  mailed by the board on or before November 1 of the year the
  license expires to every person to whom a license was issued or
  renewed during the biennial period. An application shall be
  completed and returned to the board by December 31 of that year
  with the biennial renewal fee to be set at the discretion of the
  board, but not to exceed Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00).
- (iii) Upon receipt of the application and fee, the board shall verify the accuracy of the application and issue to the applicant a certificate of renewal for the ensuing period of two (2) years. Such renewal shall render the holder thereof the right to practice as a licensed practical nurse.
- (iv) A licensed practical nurse may request in
  writing to the board that his or her license be placed on inactive
  status. The board may grant such request and shall have
  authority, in its discretion, to attach conditions to the
  licensure of such licensed practical nurse while on inactive
  status. A biennial renewal fee for inactive licensed practical

thereafter.

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- 88 nurses shall be set at the discretion of the board, not to exceed
- 89 Fifty Dollars (\$50.00).
- 90 (v) Any licensed practical nurse applying for a
- 91 license, renewal of an active license, reinstatement of a lapsed
- 92 license, or change from inactive to active status may be required
- 93 to provide evidence of continuing basic nursing competencies when
- 94 such nurse has not practiced nursing for compensation or performed
- 95 the function of a licensed practical nurse in a voluntary capacity
- 96 with or without compensation within the five-year period
- 97 immediately prior to such application for a license, renewal,
- 98 reinstatement or change of status.
- 99 (vi) Any licensed practical nurse who permits his
- 100 or her license to lapse by failing to renew the license as
- 101 provided above may be reinstated by the board upon satisfactory
- 102 explanation for such failure to renew his or her license, by
- 103 compliance with all other applicable provisions of this chapter,
- 104 by completion of a reinstatement form, and upon payment of the
- 105 reinstatement fee not to exceed Two Hundred Fifty Dollars
- (\$250.00), which shall not include the renewal fee for the current
- 107 biennial period. Any licensed practical nurse who permits his or
- 108 her license to lapse shall be notified by the board within fifteen
- 109 (15) days of such lapse.
- 110 (vii) Any person practicing as a licensed
- 111 practical nurse during the time his or her license has lapsed
- 112 shall be considered an illegal practitioner and shall be subject
- 113 to the penalties provided for violation of this chapter, provided
- 114 the licensed practical nurse has not submitted the required
- 115 reinstatement form and fees within fifteen (15) days after
- 116 notification by the board of such lapse.
- 117 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 118 and after July 1, 2007.

## Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-15-27, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO INCREASE THE MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF THE FEES THAT THE MISSISSIPPI BOARD OF NURSING MAY CHARGE FOR LICENSE RENEWAL AND LICENSE REINSTATEMENT UNDER THE NURSING PRACTICE LAW; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
