Adopted COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO

Senate Bill No. 3015

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

7 SECTION 1. Section 37-105-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows:

9 37-105-3. (1) The traffic officers duly appointed by the 10 president of any state institution of higher learning, or any 11 peace officer or highway patrolman of this state, are vested with 12 the powers and authority to perform all duties incident to 13 enforcing such rules and regulations as may be enacted under the 14 authority granted in Section 37-105-1, including the arrest of 15 violators.

16 (2) The peace officers duly employed by Jackson State University and the University of Southern Mississippi are also 17 vested with the powers and subjected to the duties of a constable 18 for the purpose of preventing all violations of law that occur 19 20 within five hundred (500) feet of any property owned by the 21 university, if such universities determine that they want such 22 peace officers to exercise such powers and if reasonably determined to have a possible impact on the safety of students, 23 faculty or staff of the university while on said property. 24 25 Provided, however, that nothing in this section shall be

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27 by such universities to events occurring outside the boundaries of 28 university property, nor shall any such university or its employees be liable for any failure to act to any event occurring 29 30 outside the boundaries of property owned by the university. 31 Jackson State University and the University of Southern 32 Mississippi may enter into an interlocal agreement with other law enforcement entities for the provision of equipment or traffic 33 34 control duties, however, the duty to enforce traffic regulations and to enforce the laws of the state or municipality off of 35 36 university property lies with the local police or sheriff's department which cannot withhold its services solely because of 37 38 the lack of such an agreement. SECTION 2. Section 37-29-275, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 39 amended as follows: 40 37-29-275. Any act, which, if committed within the limits of 41 42 a city, town or village, or in any public place, would be a violation of the general laws of this state, shall be criminal and 43 44 punishable if done on the campus, grounds or roads of any of the 45 state-supported junior colleges. The peace officers duly 46 appointed by the board of trustees of state-supported community or 47 junior colleges or officers of private security firms licensed by 48 the State of Mississippi contracted by the boards of trustees of state supported community/junior colleges are vested with the 49 50 powers and subjected to the duties of a constable for the purpose of preventing and punishing all violations of law on 51 52 state-supported junior college grounds and for preserving order 53 and decorum thereon. Peace officers appointed by the boards of trustees or officers of private security firms licensed by the 54 55 State of Mississippi contracted by the boards of trustees shall

56 have authority to bear arms in order to carry out their law57 enforcement responsibilities if such officers have been certified

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58 according to the minimum standards established by the Board on Law 59 Enforcement Officer Standards and Training. The peace officers 60 duly appointed by the boards of trustees of public community/junior colleges are also vested with the powers and 61 subjected to the duties of a constable for the purpose of 62 preventing all violations of law that occur within five hundred 63 64 (500) feet of any property owned by the college, if reasonably determined to have a possible impact on the safety of students, 65 66 faculty or staff of the college while on said property. Provided, 67 however, that nothing in this section shall be interpreted to require action by any such peace officer appointed by a college to 68 events occurring outside the boundaries of college property, nor 69 70 shall any such college or its employees be liable for any failure 71 to act to any event occurring outside the boundaries of property owned by the college. If a law enforcement officer is duly 72 73 appointed to be a peace officer by a college under this section, 74 the board of trustees of the public community/junior college may 75 enter into an interlocal agreement with other law enforcement 76 entities for the provision of equipment or traffic control duties, 77 however, the duty to enforce traffic regulations and to enforce 78 the laws of the state or municipality off of college property lies 79 with the local police or sheriff's department which cannot 80 withhold its services solely because of the lack of such an 81 agreement. 82 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from

83 and after July 1, 2007.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 37-105-3 AND 37-29-275, MISSISSIPPI 2 CODE OF 1972, TO EXPAND THE JURISDICTION OF LAW ENFORCEMENT 3 OFFICERS EMPLOYED AND DESIGNATED BY CERTAIN STATE UNIVERSITIES OR 4 PUBLIC COMMUNITY/JUNIOR COLLEGE TO INCLUDE THE AREA WITHIN 500 5 FEET OF UNIVERSITY OR COLLEGE PROPERTY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
