Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

4	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
5	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
6	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
7	defraying the expenses and paying salaries of the Veterans Affairs
8	Board for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, and ending
9	June 30, 2008\$ 4,546,082.00.
10	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
11	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special
12	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Veterans Affairs
13	Board which is comprised of special source funds collected by or
14	otherwise available to the board, for the support and maintenance
15	of said board for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, and
16	ending June 30, 2008\$ 28,564,249.00.
17	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
18	Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amounts set forth below shall
19	be expended for the respective major objects or purposes of
20	expenditure:

43	Funds are provided herein to adjust the Variable Compensation
44	Plan to ensure that all full-time employees receive a pay increase
45	equal to the realignment component of the Variable Compensation
46	Plan or One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00), whichever
47	is greater.
48	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
49	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
50	make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
51	Services" for Fiscal Year 2009 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2008
52	funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions
53	are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2009 budget by the
54	Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the

- Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 55 56 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 57 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 58 59 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 60 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2008 appropriation for "Personal 61 Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 62 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal Services, " the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 63 64 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2008 "Personal Services" 65 66 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 67 68 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 69 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.
- 70 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 71 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 72 73 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 74 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. 75 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 76 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 77 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 78 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- The agency shall not take any action to promote or otherwise award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification, realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, or any other means to increase salaries of employees or positions unless

- 87 specifically exempted by the following conditions: the award of
- 88 teacher pay increases, the advancement of a trainee/cadet to the
- 89 next level of a bona fide career ladder, the award of an
- 90 educational benchmark for the attainment of Certified Public
- 91 Accountant License or higher level professional certification as
- 92 determined by the State Personnel Board, the immediate replacement
- 93 of a departing employee with an individual from within state
- 94 service or a new hire at a salary level equivalent to that of the
- 95 departing employee, and the emergency appointment of nurses,
- 96 pharmacists or other health care professionals at a salary to be
- 97 determined by the State Personnel Board, unless otherwise
- 98 authorized in this act.
- 99 **SECTION 4.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
- 100 Sections 1 and 2, funds in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty
- 101 Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) are provided to defray the cost of
- 102 providing care to indigent/low-income Mississippi veterans and the
- 103 non-veteran surviving spouses of Mississippi veterans if the
- 104 surviving spouse was a resident of a state veterans home at the
- 105 time of the veteran's death and who, subsequent to the veteran's
- 106 death, meets the indigent/low-income criteria established by the
- 107 State Veterans Affairs Board, in the state veterans homes. It is
- 108 the intention of the Legislature that the provision pertaining to
- 109 use of indigent/low-income surviving spouses be retroactive for
- 110 any such period, prior to the effective date of this act, that a
- 111 current surviving spouse may have met the criteria. This section
- 112 and its provisions shall be known and cited as the "Hilton R.
- 113 'Jack' Vance Act of 1997."
- 114 **SECTION 5.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
- 115 Section 2, Three Hundred Fifty-four Thousand One Hundred
- 116 Twenty-three Dollars (\$354,123.00) shall be derived from the
- 117 Health Care Expendable Fund created in Section 43-13-407,

- 118 Mississippi Code of 1972, for the support and maintenance of the
- 119 Veterans' Affairs Board.
- 120 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 121 Executive Director of the Veterans' Affairs Board may authorize
- 122 increases in any major objects of expenditures in total amounts
- 123 not to exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the appropriated amount
- 124 of each major object of expenditure, provided that other major
- 125 objects of expenditure are decreased by a corresponding dollar
- 126 amount. However, no transfers shall be authorized which increase
- 127 the major object of expenditure "Salaries, Wages and Fringe
- 128 Benefits."
- 129 **SECTION 7.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 130 Veterans Affairs Board shall maintain complete accounting and
- 131 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds
- 132 appropriated under the provisions of this act and that such
- 133 records shall be in the same format and level of details as
- 134 maintained for Fiscal Year 2007. It is further the intention of
- 135 the Legislature that the budget request for Fiscal Year 2009 shall
- 136 be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format
- 137 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail
- 138 provided during the Fiscal Year 2008 budget request process.
- 139 **SECTION 8.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 140 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 141 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 142 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 143 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 144 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 145 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 146 made without competitive bids.
- 147 **SECTION 9.** It is legislative intent to ensure beneficial
- 148 information reaches as many Mississippians as possible. Further,

- 149 it is legislative intent that the expenditure of public funds for
- 150 this purpose be accomplished in an efficient and effective manner:
- 151 Therefore, state agencies as standard procedure, will observe
- 152 the following criteria:
- 153 (1) Develop goals and desired result for a campaign.
- 154 (2) Evaluate effectiveness through respected advertising
- 155 standards, including market reach and cost effectiveness.
- 156 (3) Seek public service announcements, which would be aired
- 157 by media without cost.
- 158 (4) Itemize and justify professional assistance and related
- 159 expenses for creative and production costs outside of the actual
- 160 media expenditures.
- 161 (5) Utilize Mississippi owned media companies when feasible.
- 162 **SECTION 10.** Of the funds appropriated herein, the State
- 163 Veterans Affairs Board is authorized to make payment for expenses
- 164 incurred in fiscal years 2004 and 2005 not to exceed Twenty-four
- 165 Thousand Sixty-eight Dollars and Fifteen Cents (\$24,068.15),
- 166 payable to the Department of Finance and Administration Office of
- 167 Insurance.
- 168 **SECTION 11.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 169 Veterans Affairs Board shall have the authority to escalate and
- 170 expend funds received as reimbursement of start-up costs related
- 171 to the planning and development of the Mississippi Veterans
- 172 Memorial Cemetery. These funds shall be utilized at each facility
- 173 as needed for resident security systems, repair and/or replacement
- 174 of air conditioning and heating equipment, kitchen equipment,
- 175 laundry equipment, dining equipment and furniture, medical
- 176 equipment, kitchen plumbing, other furniture, repair and
- 177 renovation of shower rooms, replacement of bathroom tile and doors
- 178 and door frame protection.
- 179 **SECTION 12.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 180 funds are provided in Section 2 to provide funding for the

- 181 start-up costs related to the Mississippi Veterans Memorial
- 182 Cemetery, the purchase of three (3) new transport handicapped vans
- 183 and the purchase of electric beds.
- 184 **SECTION 13.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
- 185 of Section 2, One Million Three Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 186 (\$1,300,000.00) shall be derived from the Working
- 187 Cash-Stabilization Reserve Fund.
- 188 **SECTION 14.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 189 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 190 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 191 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 192 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 193 proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.
- 194 SECTION 15. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 195 and after July 1, 2007.
