Funds are provided herein to adjust the Variable Compensation Plan to ensure that all full-time employees receive a pay increase equal to the realignment component of the Variable Compensation Plan or One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00), whichever is greater.

With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 38 39 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to 40 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2009 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2008 41 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 42 43 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2009 budget by the 44 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the 45 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 46 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 47 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 48 It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure act. that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 49 50 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2008 appropriation for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 51 52 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 53 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this 54 55 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2008 "Personal Services"

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56 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 57 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 58 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 59 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

60 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 61 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 62 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 63 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. 64 The 65 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 66 67 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the appropriated level. 68

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

73 The agency shall not take any action to promote or otherwise 74 award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification, 75 realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, or any other 76 means to increase salaries of employees or positions unless 77 specifically exempted by the following conditions: the award of 78 teacher pay increases, the advancement of a trainee/cadet to the 79 next level of a bona fide career ladder, the award of an 80 educational benchmark for the attainment of Certified Public Accountant License or higher level professional certification as 81 82 determined by the State Personnel Board, the immediate replacement of a departing employee with an individual from within state 83 84 service or a new hire at a salary level equivalent to that of the 85 departing employee, and the emergency appointment of nurses, 86 pharmacists or other health care professionals at a salary to be

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87 determined by the State Personnel Board, unless otherwise 88 authorized in this act.

SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 89 90 Section 1, the following sum shall be derived from money in the 91 Unemployment Trust Fund, made available to this state under 92 Section 903(d) of the Social Security Act, as amended, to the 93 Mississippi Employment Security Commission to be deposited in the Employment Security Administration Fund and used by the 94 Mississippi Employment Security Commission for the following 95 96 purposes:

97 1. Payment of various One-Stop Administration expenses that 98 support the service delivery of employment and workforce 99 information services. This includes, but is not limited to, the 100 following activities:

101 Staff for delivery of reemployment services to UI a. 102 claimants, including group job search assistance 103 and staff-assisted referrals to jobs. 104 Equipment and resources for resource rooms. b. 105 Payment for rent, utilities, and maintenance of c. 106 facilities, including common spaces such as 107 resource rooms, reception areas, conference areas, 108 etc. 109 d. Payment of shared costs for operation of local One-110 Stop Career Centers, including payment for One-111 Stop operators. 112 Purchase of computer equipment, network equipment, e. 113 telecommunications equipment, application 114 development, and other technology resources. f. Training, technical assistance, and professional 115 116 development of staff who deliver employment and 117 workforce information services. 118 Access Improvement costs for individuals with g.

disabilities, including remodeling or retrofitting 119 120 One-Stop Career Centers and purchasing appropriate software, hardware, furniture and supplies. 121 122 2. Administration of the Unemployment Compensation (UC) law 123 and its public employment service (ES) offices. This includes, 124 but is not limited to, the following uses: 125 a. ES and UI automation. This includes purchases, 126 modifications, or automation of computer related 127 systems and related costs. 128 b. UI and ES Performance Improvement costs. 129 Fraud and Abuse Reduction costs. с. UI Claims Filing and Payment Methods Improvement 130 d. 131 costs. Under the direction of the Office of Building, 132 e. 133 Grounds and Real Property Management to acquire 134 lands and construct buildings thereon or improve 135 existing buildings to be used as offices. The funds in this section are authorized for the fiscal year 136 137 beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008..... 138 53,000,000.00. The funds authorized in this Section shall be requisitioned 139 140 by the Mississippi Employment Security Commission from the 141 Unemployment Trust Fund maintained by the Secretary of the 142 Treasury of the United States as needed for the payment of obligations incurred under this appropriation, and such monies 143 144 shall be deposited in the Employment Security Administration Fund 145 in accordance with the provisions of Section 71-5-457, Mississippi Code of 1972. 146 Of the funds appropriated in this act, a total of 147 SECTION 4. 148 One Million Thirty-five Thousand Dollars (\$1,035,000.00) is

149 provided for the purpose of constructing and/or lease purchasing a 150 new headquarters facility for the Mississippi Employment Security

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155 SECTION 5. Of the funds provided under the provisions of 156 this act, Two Hundred Eighty-two Thousand Three Hundred Thirteen Dollars (\$282,313.00) is provided for One Hundred Eighteen (118) 157 reclassifications, and Two Hundred Fifty-one Thousand Two Hundred 158 159 Ninety Dollars (\$251,290.00) is provided for forty (40) 160 reallocations, and Eleven Thousand Three Hundred Twenty-three 161 Dollars (\$11,323.00) is provided for educational benchmarks, and Twenty-seven Thousand Five Hundred Five Dollars (\$27,505.00) is 162 163 provided for nine (9) experience benchmarks.

164 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that 165 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 166 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 167 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 168 169 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 170 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 171 made without competitive bids.

SECTION 7. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from

179 and after July 1, 2007.

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
