Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Workers' Compensation
Commission, for the purpose of defraying the expenses incurred by
said commission for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, and
ending June 30, 2008\$ 6,219,646.00.
SECTION 2. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
Section 1, not more than the amounts set forth below shall be
expended for the respective major objects or purposes of
expenditure:

33	Funds are provided herein to adjust the Variable Compensation
34	Plan to ensure that all full-time employees receive a pay increase
35	equal to the realignment component of the Variable Compensation
36	Plan or One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00), whichever

38	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
39	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
40	make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
41	Services" for Fiscal Year 2009 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2008
42	funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions
43	are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2009 budget by the
44	Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the
45	Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall
46	determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all
47	appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this
48	act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure
49	that no single personnel action increases this projected annual
50	cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2008 appropriation for "Personal
51	Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds.
52	If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal
53	Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency
54	has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this
55	projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2008 "Personal Services"

- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 73 The agency shall not take any action to promote or otherwise 74 award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification, 75 realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, or any other 76 means to increase salaries of employees or positions unless 77 specifically exempted by the following conditions: the award of 78 teacher pay increases, the advancement of a trainee/cadet to the 79 next level of a bona fide career ladder, the award of an 80 educational benchmark for the attainment of Certified Public Accountant License or higher level professional certification as 81 82 determined by the State Personnel Board, the immediate replacement of a departing employee with an individual from within state 83 84 service or a new hire at a salary level equivalent to that of the 85 departing employee, and the emergency appointment of nurses,

pharmacists or other health care professionals at a salary to be

- 88 authorized in this act.
- 89 **SECTION 3.** It is the intention of the Legislature that with
- 90 the funds appropriated in Section 1 and authorized for expenditure
- 91 in Section 2, the Mississippi Workers' Compensation Commission
- 92 shall enter into a contract with the industrial private sector for
- 93 the purpose of implementing a safety education and training
- 94 program.
- 95 **SECTION 4.** With the funds provided herein, it is the intent
- 96 of the Legislature that the Workers' Compensation Commission may
- 97 transfer a sum or sums not to exceed Two Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 98 (\$200,000.00) from the Administrative Expense Fund to the Second
- 99 Injury Fund.
- 100 **SECTION 5.** With the funds provided herein, it is the intent
- 101 of the Legislature that the Workers' Compensation Commission may
- 102 transfer a sum or sums not to exceed One Hundred Fifty Thousand
- 103 Dollars (\$150,000.00) from the Administrative Expense Fund to the
- 104 Insurance Integrity Enforcement Bureau within the Office of the
- 105 Attorney General.
- 106 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 107 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 108 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 109 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 110 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 111 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 112 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 113 made without competitive bids.
- 114 **SECTION 7.** With the funds provided herein, it is the
- intention of the Legislature that the Workers' Compensation
- 116 Commission may grant nonbudgeted realignments to statutory
- 117 employees as recommended by the State Personnel Board.

118	SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
119	salary of the Workers' Compensation Commission members shall be
120	equal and the salary of the Commission Chairman shall exceed these
121	salaries as approved by the State Personnel Board.
122	SECTION 9. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
123	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
124	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
125	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
126	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
127	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law
128	SECTION 10. This act shall take effect and be in force from
129	and after July 1, 2007, except for Section 7 which shall take

effect and be in force from and after its passage.
