Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 467

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- 7 **SECTION 1.** (1) The commission may authorize the issuance of
- 8 a multiyear license not to exceed four (4) years of any license
- 9 issued by the commission. The fee for a multiyear license shall
- 10 be commensurate with the total of the annual fees for the annual
- 11 license for the number of years of the multiyear license.
- 12 (2) A person authorized to issue licenses by the department
- 13 may collect and retain for issuing each license the fee authorized
- 14 under Section 49-7-17.
- SECTION 2. Section 49-7-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

- 17 49-7-21. (1) (a) The licenses for hunting, trapping or
- 18 fishing shall be issued on a form prepared by the executive
- 19 director and supplied to the bonded agents authorized to issue
- 20 licenses. The forms shall bear the name and social security
- 21 number or driver's license number of the applicant. All annual
- 22 licenses shall be valid for one (1) year after the date of its
- 23 issuance * * *. The licenses shall be issued in the name of the
- 24 commission and be countersigned by the bonded agent issuing
- 25 same. * * *
- 26 (b) A person may purchase a license from the office of
- 27 the department without appearing in person.
- 28 (c) The commission may design, establish, and
- 29 administer a program to provide for the purchase, by electronic
- 30 means, of any license, permit, registration or reservation issued
- 31 by the commission or department.

- 32 Any person authorized to issue licenses for hunting,
- 33 trapping or fishing in this state who attempts to issue a license
- on a form other than one as prescribed by this section, or 34
- 35 attempts to prepare a license certificate in any manner other than
- on the form prescribed by this section, and furnished by the 36
- 37 executive director, is guilty of a Class II violation, and shall
- be punished as provided in Section 49-7-143, Mississippi Code of 38
- 39 1972, and the person convicted shall be forever barred from
- issuing licenses in the State of Mississippi. 40
- 41 Any resident or nonresident who hunts, takes or traps
- any wild animal, bird or fish must possess a valid license issued 42
- 43 by the commission, unless specifically exempted under this
- 44 chapter.
- Any nonresident, who hunts or traps without the required 45
- license is guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof 46
- shall be fined in an amount not less than Five Hundred Dollars 47
- 48 (\$500.00) nor more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the
- first offense and shall forfeit hunting and trapping privileges 49
- 50 for a period of one (1) year. The nonresident shall also be
- 51 assessed by the court an administrative fee as prescribed under
- 52 subsection (6) of this section. For the second or any subsequent
- 53 offense a nonresident shall be fined in an amount of not less than
- One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) nor more than One Thousand Five 54
- 55 Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) or imprisoned in the county jail for
- 56 not more than thirty (30) days, or both such fine and imprisonment
- 57 and shall forfeit hunting and trapping privileges for a period of
- two (2) years. The nonresident shall also be assessed by the 58
- 59 court an administrative fee as prescribed under subsection (6) of

- (5) Any nonresident who fishes without the required license 61
- 62 is guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined in
- an amount not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more 63
- 64 than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) for the first offense.
- 65 For the second or any subsequent offense a nonresident shall be
- 66 fined in an amount not less than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars

nonresident shall also be assessed by the court an administrative 68 fee as prescribed under subsection (6) of this section. 69 70 In addition to any other fines or penalties imposed under subsection (4) or (5) of this section, any person convicted 71 for a violation of subsection (3) of this section shall be 72 assessed by the court an administrative fee equal in amount to the 73 74 cost of the hunting, trapping or fishing license fee that such person unlawfully failed to possess at the time of the violation, 75 76 the amount of which license fee shall be entered upon the ticket 77 or citation by the charging officer at the time the ticket or citation is issued. The clerk of the court in which conviction 78 for a violation of subsection (3) of this section takes place, 79 80 promptly shall collect all administrative fees imposed under this subsection and deposit them monthly with the State Treasurer, in 81 82 the same manner and in accordance with the same procedure, as nearly as practicable, as required for the collection, receipt and 83 deposit of state assessments under Section 99-19-73. However, all 84 85 administrative fees collected under the provisions of this 86 subsection shall be credited by the State Treasurer to the account of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, and may be 87 expended by the department upon appropriation by the Legislature. 88 89 (7) Any person who obtains a license under an assumed name or makes a materially false statement to obtain a license is 90 guilty of a felony and shall be subject to a fine of Two Thousand 91 Dollars (\$2,000.00) or may be imprisoned for a term not to exceed 92 93 one (1) year, or both. 94 SECTION 3.
