Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1271

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- The following shall be codified as Section 8 9 11-7-165, Mississippi Code of 1972: 11-7-165. (1) In a civil action where it is proven that a 10
- person took property having a value of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars 11
- (\$250.00) or more belonging to a vulnerable adult or any adult 12
- sixty-five (65) years of age or older by conversion, embezzlement, 13
- extortion, theft or fraud without the owner's consent, or obtained 14
- 15 the owner's consent by intimidation, deception, undue influence or
- by misusing a position of trust or a confidential relationship 16
- 17 with the owner, then whether the action is to recover the property
- or damages in lieu thereof, or both, damages shall be recoverable 18
- 19 up to three (3) times the amount of the monetary damages or value
- of the property embezzled, converted or otherwise stolen, in 20
- 21 addition to any other damages.
- 22 (2) For purposes of this section, "position of trust" shall
- include, but not be limited to, a person who: 23
- 24 Is named the attorney-in-fact in a power of
- attorney, whether executed before or after the adult became 25
- vulnerable or reached the age of sixty-five (65) years; 26
- (b) Has assumed a duty to provide care to the 27
- 28 vulnerable adult or person sixty-five (65) years or older;
- Is in a fiduciary relationship with the vulnerable 29
- 30 adult or person sixty-five (65) years or older, including a de
- facto guardian or de facto conservator; or 31
- 32 Is a joint tenant or tenant in common with the
- 33 vulnerable adult or person sixty-five (65) years or older.

- 34 (3) "Vulnerable adult" shall have the meaning defined in
- 35 Section 43-47-5, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 36 (4) Civil remedies provided under this section shall be
- 37 supplemental and cumulative, and not exclusive of other remedies
- 38 afforded under any other law. Damages awarded under this section
- 39 are remedial and not punitive, and do not limit and are not
- 40 limited by any criminal action or any other provision of law. Any
- 41 civil damages paid by the civil defendant shall reduce the amount
- 42 such defendant, upon conviction, may be ordered to pay in
- 43 restitution, and any restitution paid under a criminal penalty
- 44 shall reduce any civil damages owed.
- 45 (5) The cause of action, the right to bring a cause of
- 46 action, or the right to seek treble damages pursuant to this
- 47 section shall not be limited or affected by the death of the
- 48 owner.
- 49 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 50 and after July 1, 2007, and shall stand repealed from and after
- 51 June 30, 2007.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
